Request for Information – Additional Time to Reply

Further to our letter of 12 December 2008, I am writing to inform you that we are not yet in a position to provide you with a substantive reply to your request for information on the historic ships and aircraft the Royal Navy is responsible for maintaining.

Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain unhappy following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate the case until the internal review process has been completed.
