**Freedom of Information Act 2000**

This request is being handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Bristol City Council has determined that the request is vexatious in accordance with section 14(1).  
Section 14(1) states that:

In reaching this conclusion, Bristol City Council has taken the wider context and history of the request into account. It has therefore been determined that the volume and frequency of your requests is imposing a significant burden on Bristol City Council.
