The general effect of the experimental Orders will be to introduce eleven (11) modal filters (closure to motor vehicular traffic except for cycles) within the South Leytonstone regions situated:

on the west side of High Road Leytonstone (between Cathall Road E11 and Crownfield Road E15 (x 4): on the east side of High Road Leytonstone (between Ferndale Road E11 and Cann Hall Road E11 (x 7))

all with associated waiting restriction and parking place amendments to accompany each modal filter cluster site.

Please could you send any comments or observations in writing, specifying the grounds on which (where relevant) they are made, to my email address and the engineer(s) leading on the scheme:

Can you please provide your comments by Friday 2nd October 2020.
