Laptops issued by NES have full disk encryption as standard and NES staff are only permitted to use NES-issued encrypted flashdrives to hold official documents or data. In addition, NES will implement port control to prevent the transfer of data to unauthorised USB devices.

The NES network and email system are protected by a firewall and major web-facing systems holding personal data are subject to independent penetration testing.
