Costs and concessions

- A colour TV Licence currently costs £145.50, black and white £49
- Those aged 75 or over are entitled to apply for a free, three-year licence for their main residence – around 3.9m are currently in force. People aged 74 can apply for a short-term licence
- Those registered blind or severely sight-impaired qualify for a 50% reduction (£72.75 for a colour licence, £24.50 for black and white)
- Certain people in residential care qualify for a £7.50 'Accommodation for Residential Care' (ARC) licence



The TV Licensing Payment Card

- We understand that some people struggle to pay for their TV Licence
- We want to do all we can to help people pay for their licence and avoid a court prosecution and a fine of up to £1,000
- TV Licensing's Payment Card is designed to help make buying a TV Licence more convenient by spreading payments either weekly, fortnightly or monthly
- It is open to everyone there are no eligibility criteria. Currently 1.2 members are registered, and 20,000 new members sign up each month







The Payment Card in practice

- The first licence is paid for over 26 weeks
- Members can make payments:
 - At any PayPoint outlet (there are 23,000 across the UK)
 - Online
 - Via an automated telephone service by debit or credit card
 - By secure SMS (text message)
- Members can also check balances, statements, renewal dates and payment history via online, telephone and SMS services
- An SMS reminder service is available currently over a million text messages reminders are sent to members every month





Missed payments and arrears

- If a TV Licensing Payment Card member misses a payment, they will receive a number of reminders
 - By mail
 - By telephone
 - By SMS (if opted to receive text reminders)
 - If no payment is received at this stage, the member risks their account being handed to our arrears collection partner (iQor) who will, after requesting payment by telephone and mail, make doorstep collection visits
 - Arrears collection officers are not bailiffs and do not have power of entry

Posiadanie licencji telewizyjnej jest niezbędne, by korzystać z urządzeń talśch jak zestawy TV, urządzenia STB, video, odtwarzacze DVD, komputery, czy telefony komórkowe, aby oględać lub nagrywać programy telewizyjne, poniewat są tu programy emitrowane.

Czy zdajesz sobie sprawę, że jeżeli zostaniesz złapany na oglądaniu telewizji bez ważnej licencji telewizyjnej zostaniesz pozwany do sądu i ukarany grzywną do 1000 funtów?

A więc jeżeli używasz telewizora, musisz teraz zakupić licencję. Co do różnych sposobów opłaty proszę zobaczyć "dak nabyć licencje" poniżei.

Jeżeli używasz telewizora tylko do oglądania nie-brytyjskich programów satelitamych? Nawet jeżeli odbierasz lub zapisujesz programy transmitowane poza Wielką Brytanią, tzm niemniej potrzebujesz Licencję telewizyjną.

Czy wolisz płacić za licencję w tygodniowych ratach?

Jeżeli się przeprowadzileć pod nowy adres a masz licencję na stary adres, proszę nas o tym poinformować przez zawiadomienie telefoniczne pod nr. 0844 800 6728 lub odwiedzenia strony www.tvlicensing.co.uk/moving.

Jeżeli ukończyłeś 75 lat?

Gody otrzymany Twej fils, skontaktychny się, aby potwierdzić te sytuacje.

Jak nabyć licencję?

Licencja na telewizje kolorową obecnie kosztuje £142,50 funtów (£48,00 funty na telewizję czarno-białą). Istnieje wiele metod placenia - prosze wybrać ta, która naliepiej Ci odpowiada:



Przez stale zlecenia platnicze (Direct Debit) z twojego rachunku bankowego. Możesz płacić miesięcznie, kwartalnie lub rocznie. Aby załatwić opłaty przez złecenie płatnicze, proceż zadzwonić do nas pod nr 0844 800 6728 z darnwił bankownie pod reką lub odwiedzić www.tylicensing.o.uk/dd.





When a licence is needed, here in black and white



To celebrate the fortieth anniversary since the first colour transmissions on BBC1 and TIV is November, TV Licensing released new figures revealing over 28,000 homes acrose the UK are still enjoying their programmes in black and white. But while the figures ehowed there may yet be life in the oldset TV equipment, they also show emerging tachnologies are changing the way many people are wastching TV.*

In the face of an ever-increasing number of ways to watch TV, TV Licenning is keen that advice organisations help us to avoid any confusion by reminding people that a TV Licence is needed to watch or record programmes as they five being broadcast, whatever device they use to watch this fearurit selection.

In September, BBC IPlayer attracted over one million unique users a day watching 60.8 million TV programmer iPlayer users watched those programmee either on the internet uning computers, smart-phones and games consoles or on TV using Viroli Marilia eat-hor brews.

Yet despite there being an increasing number of ways to watch, learning back on the sofa in front of a TV set is still the most popular—with sales of flatscrean TVs almost trebling in the last three years.

TV has never been more popular but, with so many ways to watch TV now available, TV Licensing is keen to make sure people aren't confused
