By now everyone will have read the statement from ICL explaining that teaching of Applied Business Management at the Wye Campus will come to an end by 30 September 2009. ICL will be seeking to identify the opportunities for activities which would fit well at the campus. Apparently ICL are consulting Savills and have said they will not rule any suggestion out. Since the site is designed for educational purposes an educational use would seem most fitting.

ICL has written to the Parish Council and suggested a meeting. The Parish Council indicated to the clerk before Christmas that it was time to seek a routine liaison meeting with ICL but the recent news makes this more pressing.

Bound up with the future of the Wye Campus is the site submission by ICL requesting that the area from the ADAS site down to Occupation Road and Beanfield allotments (excluding the library) be designated in the Tenterden & Rural Sites DPD for mixed residential and employment development with open public space. Funds generated by such development would apparently be used to improve ICL's core site (the library and the buildings on the other side of Olantigh Road) for educational purposes. However, ICL now lacks its main educational tenant from September 2009.
