

ELM ROW - PUBLIC REALM LANDSCAPE PROPOSALS SCALE 1:500 @ A1

Design Elements:


Lime Trees - Thin out trees to open up views and reveal influence of surrounding architecture whilst maintaining amenity value and civilising influence, which reduces impacts of 6 lanes of traffic

Thinning will also provide space to recover stunted growth - consider arboricultural review to inform which trees to be removed

- 2 End Spaces Adopt a simple approach, counter the open windswept feel with simple legible designs, bold tree planting and seating located away from road edges
- Rain Gardens/Planted Areas Use green spine to incorporate rain gardens for drainage, improved biodiversity and green ground plane amongst 6 lanes of
- Central Reserve Create a simple paved central reserve, reinforce simple streetscape lines, tram/ lighting columns zone and provide a pedestrian refuge for crossings. Opportunity to potentially introduce green elements within the wider strips.
- 5 Upstand Kerb Edges Use upstand kerbs to protect potential delivery overrun and busy main road-edge and tram infrastructure and lighting columns/street furniture
- 6 Street Furniture Restrained use of furniture, to be located within the Furniture Zone.
- 7 Materials Design approach combines engineers outline solution and emerging fact sheet principles. Overall a simple design reflecting the rhythm and elegance of the Georgian facades
- 8 Bin Store To be located out of key views and located within the furniture zone to prevent obstruction to pedestrian movement.
- Public Sculpture Relocate Pigeon Sculpture and Leith Walk clock tower to create engaging public spaces.

Rain Gardens are proposed along the street to help attenuate and collect surface water un off, as well as providing amenity value




