Thanks for your email of 23rd October and for providing us with all these useful contacts, which we will share with our relevant colleagues.

Hybrid pitch at Regent's Park

With regard to the Hybrid pitch visit, I have spoken to my colleague and he is happy to set a date for showing you and your colleagues the Regent's Park pitch and providing an update on how the pitch is performing (the pitch is part of a wider programme of testing for these pitches). I will be in touch shortly with some suggested dates and suggested that the GLA sports unit may also wish to attend so I can email our contacts there the details also.

<u>Draft London Plan</u>

Since we met, colleagues and I have been through the draft Plan and the changes that have been made to the plan following our representations. Sport England has agreed to appear at the EIP on those issues we were invited to by the Planning Inspectors but if we can resolve our comments with you through written representations (or similar) we would much prefer that. Our statement is due by the 3rd December so it would be good to meet with you as soon as possible to discuss our submission at least a week before hand, which brings us to a meeting before 26th November.

We are available to meet at your offices (or ours) on the following dates; $\mathbf{7^{th}}$ November, $\mathbf{14^{th}}$

November, 19th November.

It would also greatly help with the preparation of our statement if you could answer these questions for us which relate to how the GLA intends the policies to be read;

Policy S5

- Sport England welcomes the recent additional text for Policy S5B (4). The beginning of Policy S5 B states; 'development for sports and recreation facilities should....' Is it intended that this policy should apply only to sport and recreation facilities?
- If, for example, a new school or a housing development is proposed on an existing artificial pitch or sports hall would policy S5 apply?
- Would you be prepared to amend the text of Policy S5 B to be separated into 2 parts with S5 B (4) separated from Policy S5 B (1-3) to form a new part (D) of Policy S5 to read; 'Development affecting sports and recreation facilities should...' 'ensure that there is no net loss of facilities, unless it can be demonstrated that there is no ongoing or future demand. Where published, a borough's assessment of the need for sports and recreation facilities should be used to identify ongoing or future demand.' S5(B) 1-3 would remain as they are in the draft Plan.

Protection for built sports facilities. e.g. artificial pitches, tennis courts and ancillary buildings

The London Plan defines open space as; 'All land in London that is predominantly undeveloped other than by buildings or structures that are ancillary to the open space use. The definition covers the broad range of types of open space within London, whether in public or private ownership and whether public access is unrestricted, limited or restricted.'

Does the GLA consider that artificial pitches, tennis courts, skate parks and sports pavilions are

included in this definition of open space?

London Plan indicators

We have spoken to our Insight team about a potential indicator for Active Travel. They have suggested two angles that can be taken;

1) A metric on the proportion of Londoner's taking part in Active Travel (walking or cycling) - the generic metric we provide is 'at least twice in the last 28 days', however given their objective is 2x 10 mins per person per day then perhaps something like 20+ /28+ times in the last 28 days, depending on whether they are including weekends or just week days in that aspiration. We cannot detect number of times a day.

The alternative for Active Travel which would be worth exploring is linking into what DfT already publish nationally both from Active Lives and their annual travel survey. The DfT information is here; https://www.gov.uk/government/collections/walking-and-cycling-statistics

2) A more generic sport and physical activity metric, utilising the 150+ minutes a week headline 'active' metric we use as that aligns with the CMO guidelines.

The latter is available in our published reports the former is more bespoke and we would need to go back to our Insight team if you wished to use this, unless you can link into something DfT is already producing (which would be preferable).

Insight has suggested that if you are interested in using either of these indicators, you should speak further with London Sport as they already have a target to get 1 million Londoners more active. This was slightly different to just getting more to meet 150+ minutes a week as they were looking to show progression along the spectrum of minutes, however we are not sure what they eventually settled on for that definition. Let me know if you require their contact details.
