Many thanks for your email. As we have discussed [REDACTED] and myself are minded to make some changes to S5 to achieve better alignment with the tests in paragraph 74 of the 2012 NPPF but we will need to look carefully at the precise wording, and get any changes agreed with senior managers and the Deputy Mayor.

Due to the order of the EiP matters and current priorities it will not be possible to get these approvals by this Friday the 25th of January. We do plan to get changes approved in advance of the green infrastructure hearing sessions in week 8, starting 26th of March so should be able to advise Sport England of these changes prior to this date.
