Request Under The Freedom Of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request dated 26 April 2013 in which you request the following information:

All I am requesting is the date that Balmillig was inspected as a 3 bedroom Bed & Breakfast in 2001 and who carried out the inspection?

And for your subsequent request on the 31 May 2013:

I would like to know when the Bed & Breakfast in Balmillig, 64 Colquhoun St. Helensburgh was inspected in 2001 and 2002 and who carried out the inspection?

We have considered your request, and can respond as follows:

Regarding both parts of your request, the property was inspected on 12th November 2002 by Laura Alexander, Quality and Tourism Advisor for the area.

The initial application to become part of the VisitScotland grading scheme was received after the cut-off point for 2001, and as such was processed with the following year's applications. Therefore there was no inspection in 2001.

If you are still not satisfied with our handling of your application after we have responded to your request for a review, you have a right to apply to the Scottish Information Commissioner for a decision on whether we have dealt with your request in accordance with the Act.
