

I have just received confirmation that as we discussed Ash ranges will be closed from 01 April so I suggest the statement should read;

COVID-19 - ASH RANGES UPDATE.


Ash Parish Council have been briefed by the MOD that the Ash Range complex will undergo lockdown from 01 April until further notice. This due to a large number of military units having cancelled due to personnel being re-tasked in support of OP RESCRIPT, the MOD's response to COVID-19, also all recruit training has ceased. Of course the UK will continue to support ongoing deployments world-wide, this including Afghanistan and Mali, as well as the Police. The requirement to support this will be met by the Pirbright Range complex which will remain open throughout.

Ash range staff will of course continue to man the range during this period for ongoing maintenance and to ensure the ranges can be brought back online rapidly once COVID-19 restrictions are lifted and normal duties resume. This will also ensure that in the event of an unforeseen military requirement the ranges are immediately available for use. The MOD have been advised that COVID-19 can remain on hardened surfaces for up to 72 hours and for this reason the range complex itself will be out of bounds to all non-essential personal during this period, this including members of the public as well as troops.

It is emphasised that these restrictions will only apply to the range complex itself, not the much larger Range Danger Area or RDA. As there will be no live firing at Ash during this time, the RDA will remain open to the public throughout. Flags will be down and the gates will be locked open to avoid

people coming into unnecessary contact with a hardened surface. The MOD have undertaken to maintain contact with the Parish Council throughout and a schematic showing the extent of the locked down area is attached.



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Subject: RE: Ash Ranges Access Options

Team

Thank you again for my visit a couple of weeks ago to Ash Ranges and for pulling these options together for me to have a look at. The issue is now taking up a lot of everyone's time and energy and I am keen to seek a resolution. This is how I currently see the issue:

- SE closed off public access to the Range Technical Area (RTA) at the time that COVID-19 hit and initially had closed signs on the area stating that COVID-19 was part of the issue (which were then removed).
- RTA closed for a variety of reasons (public safety, damage to estate, dog fouling, proximity to urban sprawl (therefore constant access/incursions) etc.) these are highlighted in submissions to Ministers. We need to ensure that we have these clear arguments documented, with photographic evidence, as necessary. [Action: UK Trg Estate]

- Closure of RTA not communicated as efficiently as we would have liked with local populace/MPs etc. resulting in a bow wave of correspondence.
- COA 1 and 2 below look like good mitigation for us closing access to RTA, in terms of allowing the public a safe place to walk dogs, ride bikes etc. and once works complete then most parts seem suitable for public, including disabled access.
- Some users will still not be content, as they saw access to RTA as a right and will no doubt continue to push back.

So what?

- COA 1 is already funded by CSF and is being delivered this year a good news story.
- COA 2 (cost £22,500) is yet to be allocated funding. TIC will need to take a view. [Action: TIC]
- Next steps seem likely to be in the communications/influence space, both with local populace (incl council etc.), press and MPs in order to sell the next steps as a 'we have listened to you and this is what we are doing about it' space....but grateful for expert advice.
