Please find attached the data of SAT scores. Please note that average score data is presented for UCAS cycles 2014-2018 for applicants domiciled in the United States of America only. This data is presented according to the Course Group applied for; if applicants switched their application to a different point in the application process, this has not been taken into account. Qualification scores are as declared by the applicant on their UCAS application form. This data has not been formally verified and is therefore only as correct as stated on



the form. "Offer based on" data is only available for APTs or SATs from the 2016 UCAS cycle onwards. Data prior to this (and for applicants whose principal qualification was the ACT) is recorded as Offer Based On = "Other" on our systems and so cannot be reported on in the same manner.
