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As discussed earlier, I looked over PECR for anything relating to intercepting or changing traffic, and I think you're correct, there's no specific requirement in PECR. I think perhaps I was thinking of the security requirements for CSPs but they're not relevant in this case...


I suspect the relevant law is RIPA, but I'm not intimately familiar with it. Let me check and see. We can also refer to the case of 3 and their adblocking – it's the same principle so we might get a steer on how to proceed here.
