2.8 Outcomes – trial, inquest, misconduct and UPP proceedings.	
Include whether proceedings took place, the outcome, and highlight any issues and resolutions.	
2.9 Other areas not covered by the above	
Include IPCC processes, supervision.	
2.10 IPCC learning from risks to the investigation or the organisation.
