Dear Mr Tsigarides

Thank you for your email dated 2 June in which you ask the following under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('Fol Act'):

- 'A. What do the BoE records show that a 'Royal Charter Company' actually is.
- B. What do the BoE records show regarding the jurisdiction of the BoE, in terms of Statute Law and Common Law. Is the BoE under the jurisdiction of both Common Law and Statute Law.
- C. What do the BoE records show about the printing of the United Kingdom Pound Sterling Currency. Does the BoE print the UK Sterling Currency on behalf of the UN government, and does the UK government pay interest to the BoE, or any other banking institution.'
