Dear Mrs Sear

We refer to your request where you asked:

*"Dear Prime Minister's Office,*

*I have a few questions I would like to ask under the freedom of information act.*

*Firstly I would like to know truthfully if Covid-19 is a real virus? Has it been successfully isolated and purified? If not, why not? I would like to see all documents you have relating to this.*

*Secondly, I would like to truthfully know if this virus is being exploited by the government for financial gain?*

*We all know certain members have shares in pharmaceutical companies, is this the real reason vaccines are being pushed? I would like to see a list of all government members who own shares in pharmaceutical companies and a list of those companies currently being funded to come up with a vaccine and any other documentation you have relating to this.*

*Whilst on the subject of vaccines, is it true that Bill Gates has given money to the government, and if so, why? There is an assumption that it is to do with Agenda*

*21 and depopulation, is this actually true? I would like to see a full copy of the UK Agenda 21 if you would be so kind as to provide this."*

I am writing to advise you that following a search of our paper and electronic records, Cabinet Office holds some of the information you requested. Please note the information is exempt under section 21(1) of the Freedom of Information Act. Section 21 exempts information if this information is reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means. Section 21 is an absolute exemption and the Cabinet Office is not required to consider whether the public interest favours disclosure of this information.

Cabinet Office can confirm that the answer to your question *"Firstly I would like to know truthfully if Covid-19 is a real virus?"* is that the coronavirus in question is a real virus, and Covid-19 is a real disease.

Cabinet Office does not hold any information on your question *"Has it been successfully isolated and purified? If not, why not? I would like to see all documents you have relating to this."*. To answer your question *"Secondly, I would like to truthfully know if this virus is being exploited by the government for financial gain?"* the answer is no.

You also asked:

*"We all know certain members have shares in pharmaceutical companies, is this the real reason vaccines are being pushed? I would like to see a list of all government members who own shares in pharmaceutical companies and a list of those companies currently being funded to come up with a vaccine and any other documentation you have relating to this."*
