## Request:

Could you please provide me with the total number of reported Islamophobic hate crimes for each year from 1st January 2013 to 31st May 2019. (Annual figures).

Could the data be broken down into each separate district. Thank you.

## Response:

The information you are requesting is not held by Northamptonshire Police in any reasonably retrievable form. Northamptonshire Police did not start using an Islamophobic flag until April 2017. Between 1 January 2013 and 31 March 2017 there have been 1,832 Racial or Religious Hate crimes recorded. The only means of establishing information of the nature you are requesting would be by way of manual examination of all of these records.

It is my assessment that the cost of providing you with the information requested would exceed the 'appropriate level' as set out in the Freedom of Information (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004 which is currently £450 for 'prescribed costs'. It would cost 1,832 (number of records) x 10 minutes each (minimum) = over 305 hours at £25 per hour to respond to your request.

In view of the above, and in accordance with the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, please take this as a Refusal Notice.

Although excess cost removes the force's obligations under the Freedom of Information Act, as a gesture of goodwill I have supplied information, relative to your request, retrieved before it was realised that the fees limit would be exceeded (see attached). I trust this is helpful, but it does not affect our legal right to rely on the fees regulations for the remainder of the request.

Data is based on Occurrence Created Date, and covers the period 2017 to 2019. Cancelled Records are excluded. Occurrences have been included if the SC Hate Crime field has been populated to match Muslim (Islamophobic) Hate Occurrences.

Please note that these data should be interpreted with caution. Comparing numbers of incidents/crimes can be misleading and does not necessarily indicate the likelihood of someone being a victim of crime. Systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the data. For this reason responses between forces may differ, and should not be used for comparative purposes.

If you decide to write an article / use the enclosed data we would ask you to take into consideration the factors highlighted in this document so as to not mislead members of the public or official bodies, or misrepresent the relevance of the whole or any part of this disclosed material.

You may wish to refine and resubmit your request so that it reduces the costs shown above and is then within the 'appropriate limit' shown above.
