Freedom of Information Request

Thank you for your email of 2 April requesting information under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You asked:

Please provide a list of all users who can access registered keeper details electronically under KADOE pursuant to regulation 27(1)(e) of The Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) Regulations 2002, without DVLA checking for reasonable cause prior to release of data.

The request does not include customers who are parking companies who are members of an ATA, such as the BPA.

If possible, please put the names in relevant groups such as 'Filling Stations' 'Bailiffs' 'Solicitors' 'Insurance companies' etc.


You stated that:

You are currently being investigated by the Information Commissioner for breaching GDPR, how much have you spent on external legal advice in this regard in the last 4 years?

You will be aware that we considered one of your previous requests, ref: FOIR8503, to be vexatious, under section 14 of the FOIA, because it was in relation to the release of information under Regulation 27(1)(e) of The Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) Regulations 2002. Given that this latest request has the same scope as FOIR8503, a reply will not be provided to you.

DVLA will acknowledge and consider your request, re-visiting the response provided. This is known as an Internal Review and will be considered by a staff member not involved with the original reply.
