Proposed Lidl application - (17/01206/FUL)

Dear Sam and

My two Millbrook ward councillor colleagues will separately contact you in response to the proposals by Lidl to develop a new store on the site of the former depot and Shirley Police Station.

I have engaged with many members of the public in recent weeks, through door knocking, emails, letters, during a public meeting (approximately 80 attendees) undertaken on the 31st August at St Boniface Church Hall. My Labour Councillor colleagues and I also gave residents an opportunity to complete feedback forms to indicate their views on the proposals.

Broadly the majority of those local residents who responded or were questioned supported the proposed new store, however, the following comments, issues and concerns were raised during the engagement undertaken:

- 1. Traffic and highways impact This was the issue that was raised most often with me, and specifically the following points were raised:
 - a. The road surface of Villiers Road is unacceptable and would need to be resurfaced;
 - b. Concerns were raised regarding the customer vehicles entering and exiting the store, the junction of Villiers Road is not seen as suitable to allow cars to exit smoothly on to Shirley High Street, due to the level of existing users on the road. This would therefore force customers to use the existing 'ratrun' of Heysham Road and English Road. Due to the nature of Heysham Road and English Road, which are already congested, an increase in users on this road would not only negatively impact the lives of those residents living on this road, but also on safety. Concerns were also raised about the extant planning permission on the redevelopment of the gym site opposite, this will also put a large number of new cars and requirement for parking on to local roads.
 - c. Concerns were also raised regarding cycling and cyclists using the Shirley High Street, residents and stakeholders felt this was already a dangerous road they were therefore keen to see cycling lanes introduced to reduce potential danger to cyclists;
 - d. A larger store would either need more deliveries or larger lorries, both solutions were felt to be unsatisfactory, particular concerns were raised regarding lorries gaining access via English Road and Heysham Road;
 - e. Concern was also raised that the development of the store would lead to an increase of on-street parking on the road that will border the new store;
 - 2. Building line The building line of the store on Shirley High Street was raised by many as an area of concern. If the existing building line of Shirley High Street was to be maintained, the resulting loss of the Yew Tree and moving of the 'Mile Stone' was seen by many as unacceptable. If the existing building line of the police station was to be maintained, the possibility of creating a new bus stop lay-by set slightly back off the road was suggested. It was also suggested that a seating area fronting onto Shirley High Street, could benefit the area as well as a pedestrian access point onto Shirley was also recommended;
 - 3. An unsatisfactory loss of protected trees with TPO's;
 - 4. Works traffic, noise, dust and impact during demolition and construction was raised by many particularly in the vicinity of the store;
 - 5. Shopping Trolley security, concern about trolleys being dumped in the vicinity of the store was often raised;
 - 6. Concerns were raised about the traffic survey that formed part of the application, particularly the classification of old store traffic as discounted trips;
 - 7. Light and noise pollution from the car-park, many concerns raised regarding high lampposts shining into peoples gardens and houses. Low level lighting was requested by many;
 - 8. Potential anti-social behaviour in the car-park was also raised, out of hours locked gates on the car park were requested;
 - 9. The wall that currently exists at the end of the gardens on Mayflower Road, needs to be replaced, if the existing wall is removed;

10. Air quality is already a big local issue, it was felt that Lidl could do a lot more to make the store more environmentally friendly.Other issues raised which are unconnected to this application were also raised, namely:

- 1. The future of the existing store site.
- 2. Lidl and their treatment of staff.

In my summing up, I broadly accept the principle of developing a new Lidl Store on the site and I feel the site lends itself well to a retail development, however, I share the vast majority of the concerns detailed above, particularly those related to the 'traffic and highways impact' (Point 1) and building line (Point 2).

Re: REF: Planning Application 17/01206/FUL - Lidl, Shirley Road

My two Millbrook colleagues will be contacting you separately with the reactions of the constituents who have contacted them.

In general the emails I have received from residents has been supportive of the building of a new LIDL store on the site. I haven't tallied up the number of people who have contacted me but it has been a substantial number. I have also been contacted by many Southampton residents outside the boundaries of the Millbrook ward primarily because of the wide ranging letter which LIDL sent to most of the west side of the city. Myself and my Millbrook colleagues talked to dozens of the residents in the immediate vicinity of the proposed store and I also took notes at our public meeting on August 31st to gauge what people were saying. A small minority of residents completely opposed the building of a new store and wanted housing built on the side instead but as I say a very small minority.

There were two main concerns which a large majority of respondents mentioned:

- 1. The trees primarily the old Yew tree on Shirley High St. People were vehemently against this tree being removed as it is seen as an historical tree and as it is on the pavement it would not interfere with the operations of a LIDL store. This tree should be kept and LIDL told to change their plans. Two of the other three trees have a TPO and every effort should be made to keep these trees intact. LIDL should be asked to go away and rethink the siting of their store for this reason. Also the milestone should be kept.
- 2. Traffic Shirley Rd/Shirley High Street are very busy roads and a new store will add to the amount of traffic. The entrance and exit to the store is in Villiers Road. Villiers Road is already heavily used as there is the Royal mail depot and the Eazy gym opposite the proposed site. Villiers Road is also used as a rat run by cars to access Shirley from the houses through Heysham Rd and the housing towards Waterhouse Lane/English Rd/Regents Park Rd. The junction of Villiers Road with Heysham is a narrow dog leg and is difficult to manoeuvre. The road surface in Villiers Road is in a very bad state and needs resurfacing. The LIDL representative at the public meeting mentioned this so any scheme will need to take this into account. Maybe as part of any section 106 agreement LIDL would provide the money to do this. There has also been a suggestion that Villiers Road be closed by the last house so making it a cul de sac and stopping through traffic. I would like traffic engineers to consider this proposal.

These have been the two main topics raised by my constituents but other things have also been raised which are very valid concerns:

Make sure parking is only for shoppers not commuters. There is a lack of parking in this general area and residents are concerned about increased parking by commuters

Height of walls on Heysham Rd and Mayflower Rd. The boundary of the site will be at the back of the houses in Heysham Road and Mayflower road. Residents in these roads expressed concerns about the security of their properties as their houses would be open to potential burglars and intruders. Obviously at present there is limited access. Also people in Mayflower Road wanted the present back wall kept and not demolished.

The lights in the car park should be at a lower level to avoid shining into people's houses.

A resident said that the plans included an electrical substation directly against their wall ,he wanted it moved

Traffic should be directed to turn towards Shirley Rd on exiting the site to avoid driving into the housing estate.

Is there an Iron Age/Bronze Age settlement underneath the site, if so needs to be investigated.

Noise and disturbance during demolition and construction and hours of work. There should be strict conditions on work carried out to demolish the site. Workers should be asked to park on site not in adjoining roads. In addition deliveries once the store is built should also be restricted.

LIDL should take responsibility to avoid litter and make it difficult for people to take away shopping trollies.

There should be extensive cycling provision on the site to encourage cycling.

Cllr Furnell Additional comments

I have some additional things which have not been raised by residents but which I would like to add The plans show an empty roof. This is an ideal opportunity for LIDL to show environmental concern and install solar panels on their roof. I noticed that they have done this in other stores in Europe.

LIDL should recycle rain water to use in the store.

Installation of several electric charge points so shoppers can charge their vehicles whilst shopping. This is future proofing their store as this technology takes off in the next few years.

I am sure that other things will be fed into the discussion but I think I have included everything I have been told by residents during our consultation.

Feedback from Lidl consultation period

Dear Sam, and officers,

Following the consultation period offered in regard to the proposed Lidl relocation, here is the feedback from residents who have contacted me directly, either by email or as part of a series of household canvassing sessions conducted by myself and my Millbrook ward colleagues.

Overall, there was considerable support, in principal, for the proposal but several significant concerns were raised. In the main, these were based on traffic and noise issues plus some specific comments about the proposed removal of protected trees and the historic milestone that are located in the site.

Substantial or detailed comments have been copied at the end of this email for reference.

To summarise, I personally received 15 emails.

- 2 of these expressed wholehearted support of the application
- 3 of these specified road/traffic concerns
- 3 of these were solely concerned about the loss of the yew tree and other protected trees
- 3 of these expressed combined concerns about road and tree issues
- 4 of these expressed other concerns (including broader environmental concerns and worries about the effect on smaller independent retailers in the area

Cllrs Denness, Furnell and I canvassed streets in the area potentially most immediately affected by the proposed move. The feedback I received from this canvassing mirrors many of the views expressed at the meeting held on August 31st. In general, residents were very supportive of the move but were extremely concerned about the impact on residential roads adjacent to the proposed store site. Equally, a number of residents felt the loss of protected trees, the yew tree in particular, and the milestone, would be very detrimental to the heritage of the locality.

As a Millbrook resident myself, I too support the proposal, in principle, but agree with much of the feedback I have received that traffic and road use issues are significant as they could lead to serious problems for those who live close to the site and, more generally, for road users and pedestrians in the area.

I also feel that air, light and noise pollution that may result from the move must be acknowledged and that the Lidl application has not yet addressed these with sufficient detail or sensitivity.

I would also appreciate some indication of Lidl's intentions to 'give back' to the community. Should a new store be approved, it would no doubt be of considerable benefit to the company. The location of the store affects 3 local wards (Millbrook, Shirley and Freemantle) that have significant areas of deprivation and community groups that require help. I would very much welcome a dialogue with interested parties in this matter to explore how Lidl could use their greater profile in these communities to support and promote voluntary and charitable organisations and events.

I am quite happy for the Lidl development to go ahead but I with the following comments considered.

1. The ancient Yew tree (subject to TPO) in front of the Police Station cannot be removed - it and the historic milestone are of important historic value to Shirley. The development can continue quite easily with the tree in place - it should positively embrace it!

There is needle and berry fall - only a shame our council road sweepers, based in the council yard around the corner, couldn't have given them a regular clean-up. Lidl can do it now, please.

NB. The Yew tree is, in a way, symptomatic of the councils total ignorance of its responsibility to the trees that it is responsible for. The council's attitude seems to be that the trees are ignored until they fall into a dangerous condition when they can cut them down.

There are many trees in the Shirley area heavily infested with mistletoe! The odd bit of mistletoe is quite attractive but it must be controlled before it kills the tree. This could be a nice little earner for someone every Christmas, go on a harvest and sell it in the precinct.

- 2. My garden is perfectly quiet right now Lidl plans show an electrical substation next to my boundary wall, unless this substation is absolutely silent, I would prefer it was located further away from my boundary.
- 3. Traffic leaving the Lidl car park should be made to turn left onto Shirley High Street and not allowed to increase the heavily congested Heysham Road just like the traffic leaving Easy Gym/ Post Office with the signage and road design not shown on Lidl drawings.

I cannot see any good coming from having the two access ways opposite each other - I can only see the development of a traffic black-spot!

Access to Shirley High Street would be improved by the creation of two lanes for traffic turning left and right.

Shirley High Street is heavily congested at the best of times. The council should be pro-active in this area and be trying to reduce the traffic in Shirley and make every attempt at improving traffic flow. The recent changes to the traffic priorities where Regent Park Road join the High Street and the traffic light timing have greatly worsened traffic flow - more vehicles stopped and pushing out exhaust fumes. The situation is made works by an excess of busses along the High Street competing for the same passengers. The removal of the bus lay-bys in the previous 'improvements' also adds to the problem. When busses stop to pick-up passengers the road is brought to standstill.

This development will provide additional footfall and a bus lay by would help to ease traffic movement. The buses will not have a problem pulling out into to moving traffic - bus drivers are quite adept at pushing their way in!

- 4. Every time an articulated vehicle exits Villiers road and turn right on Shirley High Street it rides over the pedestrian crossing island opposite St Boniface Church this island will have to be moved further along the road.
- 5. Villiers Road is in an abysmal condition a great advert for the road outside the council maintenance yard! I trust this development will provide a new heavy duty surface.
- 6. Below this site is a Bronze / Iron age settlement I trust this will be sensitively excavated to reveal what treasures may be there?
- 7. There are many buildings of heritage value on this site please investigate the possibilities of salvaging them to give them good homes.
- 8. Villiers Road would greatly be improved with the addition of a pedestrian crossing it can be quite hazardous to cross it now before the addition of any traffic from Lidl.

There has been lots of talk of traffic, the yew tree and we had a positive meeting last night re ideas for better cycling access to the proposed Lidl (our collaborative cycle report to be forwarded to you soon).

However, I'm not sure how much local discussion has happened around the retail impact of this larger store? As well as loss to the main supermarket chains, £0.4million will be lost from smaller shops on Shirley High Street, a number of which are independently owned. A further £0.3m lost from outside Shirley. I'm not concerned about the loss to Sainsburys or Tescos, but there is a problem with indies struggling as a result of international chains coming into and dominating the city.

Para 4.18 of Retail Statement "We assume that all the existing Lidl's trade will transfer across to the new store, which leaves £2.1m of additional turnover to be diverted from other shops. This is a worst-case scenario since in practice the additional floorspace provided in the larger store will in part be used for qualitative improvements that will improve the shopping environment but may not result in an uplift in turnover. We estimate that £1.3m of this £2.1m will come from the Sainsbury store, £0.1m from the Tesco Express and £0.4m from other shops in the centre (which will include the Iceland). The remaining £0.3m is expected to come from stores outside Shirley. None of the resulting impacts are significant, with the highest being -6.9% on the Sainsbury. It should also be noted that the table excludes the Co-op on Shirley Road, which was included in the retail study but has since closed. The turnover of that store is likely to have been redistributed to other shops within the centre, which will assist in ameliorating any impact from the new Lidl."

The report is a bit insensitive when it says "none of the resulting impacts are significant". Independent businesses are struggling in Southampton. If a local shop, perhaps one of our international stores, closes as a direct result of Lidl's expansion it will be significant to the owners and their customers that value their various product lines. I would have liked to see much more of an assessment of the impact of the diversity of shopping options in Shirley. 0.4million is a large amount of spend. Many stores are operating on very narrow margins already.

Lidl's business model does not include a café, pharmacy, post office etc but it may be worth including a condition to ensure these are not able to be included at a later date or other activity which could further threaten the vitality and viability of the high street.

I'm not clear whether the new Coop on Foundry Lane has been factored into the equation, and whether the new Lidl will impact on viability of this store which is within good walking distance of lots of Freemantle residents, some of whom will drive if they have to go to Shirley Road for their convenience shopping. I would imagine this shop will suffer from Lidl's relocation.

I am working on the Creative Places project at the moment which is all about the independent spirit of the city, ensuring places that support creative and community activity can flourish. On a side note, there has been an increase recently in indie places asking for public support to ensure they are sustained e.g. the Hobbit, Joiners, Board in the City, the Art House, October Books (all outside your wards but I wonder which venue will be next?). This is partly a consequence of the evening economy being redirected to big chains via West Quay watermark, and we have had some sad closures of much loved places such as The Notes café and Dock of the Bay, not to mention many more than are not quite as well known in the city, but were well valued by their loyal customers.

The Council is under public pressure to support struggling indies with rate relief and demonstrate its commitment to the locally-owned economy.

Whilst I have no objection to the proposals for the new store itself, my concern is with the increase in the volume of traffic that it will generate in the local area.

I live in English Rd and this is already a very busy rat run to town to avoid Shirley High St traffic congestion. Vehicles come from the dual carriage way, and also the High St, via Regents Park Rd, Waterhouse Way, English Rd, Foundry Lane & often Villiers Rd. Villiers Rd itself is a very narrow road, difficult to navigate because of the parked vehicles and the sharp blind bend.

BAT is also on Waterhouse Way. It is a major employer, already generating a significant amount of traffic, including large, heavy commercial vehicles.

As there is a primary school on the corner of English Rd & Foundry Lane, traffic is particularly heavy on the school run. I do have concerns about pupil safety during these times if even more traffic is using this short cut to access the proposed Lidl store.

My objection to the planning application is based purely on the increased volume of traffic that it will generate in an already very busy area & of course, child safety.

Please do share my concerns at your meeting about this planning application.

We have received a letter from Lidle UK dated 11 August outlining their proposed relocation to the corner of Shirley Road/Villiers Road, Shirley. We cannot stress how strongly we object to this projected moved.

Villiers Road is very narrow and as you will know Shirley Road is, at most times of the day, extremely busy. We cannot see how Lidle's very large delivery lorries (and possibly other companies' vehicles) will negotiate the proposed only entrance there will be to the site from Villiers Road along with customer traffic. There is also a busy right turn into Shirley Avenue almost opposite the site. This stretch of Shirley Road becomes quickly congested when buses are parked at the bus stop directly outside the site and vehicles are turning right into Shirley Avenue and also trying to come out of Villiers Road.

Secondly, we object to the tree being removed from the front of the proposed site. There is very little that is pleasant about this area of Shirley now and the tree is a rather nice feature. We know Lidle have proposed compensating for the loss of trees by planting a "tree lined avenue on Villiers Road". Quite frankly this is a ridiculous proposal — would they not be more appreciated in Shirley Road/High Street?) It will only be a matter of time before the trees are either vandalised or damaged by delivery lorries/traffic.

Finally, there is an old milestone directly in front of the tree on Shirley Road giving the distance to Southampton and Romsey. Is this quirky little feature going to be preserved? There is no mention of it in Lidl's publicity letter or on their very detailed site plan. We have no idea how old this milestone is but we think it would be desperately sad to lose it, which given the cavalier way Southampton treats its heritage, is highly likely.

There really is no precedent for a supermarket of this size fronting directly onto Shirley Road. Sainsburys is the only other large supermarket in the area and they are off the main road in Shirley Precinct. We can see no reason for Lidls to move from their present site except to increase their profits.

I have serious concerns on the amount of extra traffic that your new store will generate, the junction of Shirley Road and Villiers Road is already a nightmare to get in and out of and Shirley High Street is always very busy.

It is my belief that your traffic survey is flawed.

Firstly the survey has discounted the traffic that uses the existing store, well unless the existing store is turn into a park there will still be traffic using that building after Lidl have moved. Just because it is not Lidl's customers causing the traffic does not mean it should be discounted.

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Thirdly the survey cites a store in Ringwood against a proposed store in Southampton. The population density and infrastructure of the two places are completely different, this is a meaningless comparison.

I would also like to say that it is a disgrace that the tree on Shirley Road is removed, it has been there a very long time and it still looks in very good health.

Also I can find no reference in the proposal to the distance marker stone at the base of the tree, I think this is a datum point, a feature of Shirley and should be preserved in the place it stands today.

I have read the proposed development planning application and the documents that were posted to local residents.

I too share the concerns of recent articles in the Southern Daily Echo, regarding the traffic and congestion in Villiers Road/Shirley Road, and the impact the proposals would have to the local area.

My main objection and concern however, is in regards to the removal of the trees from the sight which are subject to Tree Preservation Orders. Most notably the Yew tree and mile marker which stand at the front of the sight. Why can't the proposal be changed in order for the trees to be kept?! All they need to do is step the front of the store back slightly to allow the Yew tree to remain. This tree has been there for an awful long time, and is a beloved fixture of the street scene! I do feel that the company have not taken into account the true feelings of the locals into account. Why allow for planting along the side of the store in Villiers Road, when it faces a car park for the gym and postal sorting office?! It does not make sense to have it this way. Plant the trees along the front and allow the Yew to remain!

I feel like putting up a banner "SAVE OUR YEW TREE!", or picketing the site to prevent its removal!

Whilst Lidl may need a new site, the move onto the High Street in Shirley will have a detrimental effect on local independent shops. There are also supermarkets within very close distance (Sainsbury's), Tesco Express. Two stores on the same stretch of road have closed, Co-op and Morrisons (which was situated very near to the suggested site). I also believe that the site, although needs to be developed, is crying out for housing, and some small shops facing onto Shirley Road, to carry on the 'local feel' of the High Street/Road with smaller shops. Also the traffic turning in and out of Villiers Road will increase, and lorries delivering to Lidl will be competing with lorries delivering mail to the Royal Mail sorting centre. The junction cannot be widened enough to cope with these heavy vehicles and traffic would need preventing access from Villiers Road into Heysham Road, residential roads and parking is bad enough in those roads at the moment as It is. Particularly at school times when I believe traffic increases a great deal, and as these roads lead directly to a school it could also cause even further issues.

The yew tree in front of the store is obviously a recognised landmark and valued by local residents, it also has a TPO. It is part of the furniture of the High Street and should not be removed.

Lidl obviously need a new site, but I don't believe this is the right place for it. A development of housing, and small shops, and possibly a children's play park and green planting would be far better for Shirley business, and it's residents.

As a resident of Freemantle and regular Lidl customer, I received a letter this morning showing me the proposed plans for the new Lidl store.

I do think this is a much needed upgrade and do support the new store opening.

Although, I do not support the removal of the Yew tree that is situated on Shirley Road, this is an iconic part of the high street and would be very upset to see it go.

I believe that this could be incorporated into the plans so that the store can still be built and the tree can also stay. When the police station was built in 1970 they incorporated the tree so why can't Lidl?

The tree is more iconic to the people of Southampton than the brand, and would only contribute to the image not take away from it. I feel so strongly about this matter that if the site is built and tree is removed or damaged I will no longer be using Lidl.

I hope that there will be some solution that both can be incorporated and I will look forward to visiting the new store.

While I welcome the re-development of the old Shirley Police Station site by Lidls, I am concerned that the old Yew tree, a Shirley landmark, going back at least 150 years (maybe more) has to be destroyed.

In Lidl's application in 2016, details were provided that indicated the old tree would be protected and retained. In their 2017 reapplication they maintain that the tree will have to be removed. Strange as that this later application contained a detailed arboreal reporting that the tree was classed as an A rated, historical tree, unique in the area.

The developers state that the Yew tree will "spoil" the line of their store frontage. No defence in my book.

The Yew tree and the accompanying old milestone in front of it are as close to the boundary with the pavement in Shirley Road as they can be.

I sincerely hope you can do your utmost to impress on the developers and council members and officers involved that this much loved tree is protected and retained.



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

Dear Sam, and officers,

Following the consultation period offered in regard to the proposed Lidl relocation, here is the feedback from residents who have contacted me directly, either by email or as part of a series of household canvassing sessions conducted by myself and my Millbrook ward colleagues.

Overall, there was considerable support, in principal, for the proposal but several significant concerns were raised. In the main, these were based on traffic and noise issues plus some specific comments about the proposed removal of protected trees and the historic milestone that are located in the site.

Substantial or detailed comments have been copied at the end of this email for reference.

To summarise, I personally received 15 emails.

- 2 of these expressed wholehearted support of the application
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Cllrs Denness, Furnell and I canvassed streets in the area potentially most immediately affected by the proposed move. The feedback I received from this canvassing mirrors many of the views expressed at the meeting held on August 31st. In general, residents were very supportive of the move but were extremely concerned about the impact on residential roads adjacent to the proposed store site. Equally, a number of residents felt the loss of protected trees, the yew tree in particular, and the milestone, would be very detrimental to the heritage of the locality.

As a Millbrook resident myself, I too support the proposal, in principle, but agree with much of the feedback I have received that traffic and road use issues are significant as they could lead to serious problems for those who live close to the site and, more generally, for road users and pedestrians in the area.

I also feel that air, light and noise pollution that may result from the move must be acknowledged and that the Lidl application has not yet addressed these with sufficient detail or sensitivity.

I would also appreciate some indication of Lidl's intentions to 'give back' to the community. Should a new store be approved, it would no doubt be of considerable benefit to the company. The location of the store affects 3 local wards (Millbrook, Shirley and Freemantle) that have significant areas of deprivation and community groups that require help. I would very much welcome a dialogue with interested parties in this matter to explore how Lidl could use their greater profile in these communities to support and promote voluntary and charitable organisations and events.

EMAILED COMMENTS FROM RESIDENTS:

I am quite happy for the Lidl development to go ahead but I with the following comments considered.

1. The ancient Yew tree (subject to TPO) in front of the Police Station cannot be removed - it and the historic milestone are of important historic value to Shirley. The development can continue quite easily with the tree in place - it should positively embrace it!

There is needle and berry fall - only a shame our council road sweepers, based in the council yard around the corner, couldn't have given them a regular clean-up. Lidl can do it now, please.

NB. The Yew tree is, in a way, symptomatic of the councils total ignorance of its responsibility to the trees that it is responsible for. The council's attitude seems to be that the trees are ignored until they fall into a dangerous condition when they can cut them down.

There are many trees in the Shirley area heavily infested with mistletoe! The odd bit of mistletoe is quite attractive but it must be controlled before it kills the tree. This could be a nice little earner for someone every Christmas, go on a harvest and sell it in the precinct.

- 2. My garden is perfectly quiet right now Lidl plans show an electrical substation next to my boundary wall, unless this substation is absolutely silent, I would prefer it was located further away from my boundary.
- 3. Traffic leaving the Lidl car park should be made to turn left onto Shirley High Street and not allowed to increase the heavily congested Heysham Road just like the traffic leaving Easy Gym/ Post Office with the signage and road design not shown on Lidl drawings.

I cannot see any good coming from having the two access ways opposite each other - I can only see the development of a traffic black-spot!

Access to Shirley High Street would be improved by the creation of two lanes for traffic turning left and right.

Shirley High Street is heavily congested at the best of times. The council should be pro-active in this area and be trying to reduce the traffic in Shirley and make every attempt at improving traffic flow. The recent changes to the traffic priorities where Regent Park Road join the High Street and the traffic light timing have greatly worsened traffic flow - more vehicles stopped and pushing out exhaust fumes. The situation is made works by an excess of busses along the High Street competing for the same passengers. The removal of the bus lay-bys in the previous 'improvements' also adds to the problem. When busses stop to pick-up passengers the road is brought to standstill.

This development will provide additional footfall and a bus lay by would help to ease traffic movement. The buses will not have a problem pulling out into to moving traffic - bus drivers are quite adept at pushing their way in!

4. Every time an articulated vehicle exits Villiers road and turn right on Shirley High Street it rides over the pedestrian crossing island opposite St Boniface Church - this island will have to be moved further along the road.

- 5. Villiers Road is in an abysmal condition a great advert for the road outside the council maintenance yard! I trust this development will provide a new heavy duty surface.
- 6. Below this site is a Bronze / Iron age settlement I trust this will be sensitively excavated to reveal what treasures may be there?
- 7. There are many buildings of heritage value on this site please investigate the possibilities of salvaging them to give them good homes.
- 8. Villiers Road would greatly be improved with the addition of a pedestrian crossing it can be quite hazardous to cross it now before the addition of any traffic from Lidl.

A further £0.3m lost from outside Shirley. I'm not concerned about the loss to Sainsburys or Tescos, but there is a problem with indies struggling as a result of international chains coming into and dominating the city.

Para 4.18 of Retail Statement "We assume that all the existing Lidl's trade will transfer across to the new store, which leaves £2.1m of additional turnover to be diverted from other shops. This is a worst-case scenario since in practice the additional floorspace provided in the larger store will in part be used for qualitative improvements that will improve the shopping environment but may not result in an uplift in turnover. 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

This is partly a consequence of the evening economy being redirected to big chains via West Quay watermark, and we have had some sad closures of much loved places such as The Notes café and Dock of the Bay, not to mention many more than are not quite as well known in the city, but were well valued by their loyal customers.

The Council is under public pressure to support struggling indies with rate relief and demonstrate its commitment to the locally-owned economy.

Whilst I have no objection to the proposals for the new store itself, my concern is with the increase in the volume of traffic that it will generate in the local area.

I live in English Rd and this is already a very busy rat run to town to avoid Shirley High St traffic congestion. Vehicles come from the dual carriage way, and also the High St, via Regents Park Rd, Waterhouse Way, English Rd, Foundry Lane & often Villiers Rd. Villiers Rd itself is a very narrow road, difficult to navigate because of the parked vehicles and the sharp blind bend.

BAT is also on Waterhouse Way. It is a major employer, already generating a significant amount of traffic, including large, heavy commercial vehicles.

As there is a primary school on the corner of English Rd & Foundry Lane, traffic is particularly heavy on the school run. I do have concerns about pupil safety during these times if even more traffic is using this short cut to access the proposed Lidl store.

My objection to the planning application is based purely on the increased volume of traffic that it will generate in an already very busy area & of course, child safety.

Please do share my concerns at your meeting about this planning application.

We have received a letter from Lidle UK dated 11 August outlining their proposed relocation to the corner of Shirley Road/Villiers Road, Shirley. We cannot stress how strongly we object to this projected moved.

Villiers Road is very narrow and as you will know Shirley Road is, at most times of the day, extremely busy. We cannot see how Lidle's very large delivery lorries (and possibly other companies' vehicles) will negotiate the proposed only entrance there will be to the site from Villiers Road along with customer traffic. There is also a busy right turn into Shirley Avenue almost opposite the site. This stretch of Shirley Road becomes quickly congested when buses are parked at the bus stop directly outside the site and vehicles are turning right into Shirley Avenue and also trying to come out of Villiers Road.

Secondly, we object to the tree being removed from the front of the proposed site. There is very little that is pleasant about this area of Shirley now and the tree is a rather nice feature. We know Lidle have proposed compensating for the loss of trees by planting a "tree lined avenue on Villiers Road". Quite frankly this is a ridiculous proposal – would they not be more appreciated in Shirley Road/High Street?) It will only be a matter of time before the trees are either vandalised or damaged by delivery lorries/traffic.

Finally, there is an old milestone directly in front of the tree on Shirley Road giving the distance to Southampton and Romsey. Is this quirky little feature going to be preserved? There is no mention of it in Lidl's publicity letter or on their very detailed site plan. We have no idea how old this milestone is but we think it would be desperately sad to lose it, which given the cavalier way Southampton treats its heritage, is highly likely.

There really is no precedent for a supermarket of this size fronting directly onto Shirley Road. Sainsburys is the only other large supermarket in the area and they are off the main road in Shirley Precinct. We can see no reason for Lidls to move from their present site except to increase their profits.

I have serious concerns on the amount of extra traffic that your new store will generate, the junction of Shirley Road and Villiers Road is already a nightmare to get in and out of and Shirley High Street is always very busy.

It is my belief that your traffic survey is flawed.

Firstly the survey has discounted the traffic that uses the existing store, well unless the existing store is turn into a park there will still be traffic using that building after Lidl have moved. Just because it is not Lidl's customers causing the traffic does not mean it should be discounted.

Secondly the survey show that the existing Lidl's car par is being used by customers using the Polish supermarket. I believe this will happen on a bigger scale at the proposed site, people will use Lidl's car park and go in other shops generating more traffic than predicted.

Thirdly the survey cites a store in Ringwood against a proposed store in Southampton. The population density and infrastructure of the two places are completely different, this is a meaningless comparison.

I would also like to say that it is a disgrace that the tree on Shirley Road is removed, it has been there a very long time and it still looks in very good health.

Also I can find no reference in the proposal to the distance marker stone at the base of the tree, I think this is a datum point, a feature of Shirley and should be preserved in the place it stands today.

I have read the proposed development planning application and the documents that were posted to local residents.

I too share the concerns of recent articles in the Southern Daily Echo, regarding the traffic and congestion in Villiers Road/Shirley Road, and the impact the proposals would have to the local area.

My main objection and concern however, is in regards to the removal of the trees from the sight which are subject to Tree Preservation Orders. Most notably the Yew tree and mile marker which stand at the front of the sight. Why can't the proposal be changed in order for the trees to be kept?! All they need to do is step the front of the store back slightly to allow the Yew tree to remain. This tree has been there for an awful long time, and is a beloved fixture of the street scene! I do feel that the company have not taken into account the true feelings of the locals into account. Why allow for planting along the side of the store in Villiers Road, when it faces a car park for the gym and postal sorting office?! It does not make sense to have it this way. Plant the trees along the front and allow the Yew to remain!

I feel like putting up a banner "SAVE OUR YEW TREE!", or picketing the site to prevent its removal!

Whilst Lidl may need a new site, the move onto the High Street in Shirley will have a detrimental effect on local independent shops. There are also supermarkets within very close distance (Sainsbury's), Tesco Express. Two stores on the same stretch of road have closed, Co-op and Morrisons (which was situated very near to the suggested site). I also believe that the site, although needs to be developed, is crying out for housing, and some small shops facing onto Shirley Road, to carry on the 'local feel' of the High Street/Road with smaller shops. Also the traffic turning in and out of Villiers Road will increase, and lorries delivering to Lidl will be competing with lorries delivering mail to the Royal Mail sorting centre. The junction cannot be widened enough to cope with these heavy vehicles and traffic would need preventing access from Villiers Road into Heysham Road, residential roads and parking is bad enough in those roads at the moment as It is. Particularly at school times when I believe traffic increases a great deal, and as these roads lead directly to a school it could also cause even further issues.

The yew tree in front of the store is obviously a recognised landmark and valued by local residents, it also has a TPO. It is part of the furniture of the High Street and should not be removed.

Lidl obviously need a new site, but I don't believe this is the right place for it. A development of housing, and small shops, and possibly a children's play park and green planting would be far better for Shirley business, and it's residents.

As a resident of Freemantle and regular Lidl customer, I received a letter this morning showing me the proposed plans for the new Lidl store.

I do think this is a much needed upgrade and do support the new store opening.

Although, I do not support the removal of the Yew tree that is situated on Shirley Road, this is an iconic part of the high street and would be very upset to see it go.

I believe that this could be incorporated into the plans so that the store can still be built and the tree can also stay. When the police station was built in 1970 they incorporated the tree so why can't Lidl?

The tree is more iconic to the people of Southampton than the brand, and would only contribute to the image not take away from it. I feel so strongly about this matter that if the site is built and tree is removed or damaged I will no longer be using Lidl.

I hope that there will be some solution that both can be incorporated and I will look forward to visiting the new store.

While I welcome the re-development of the old Shirley Police Station site by Lidls, I am concerned that the old Yew tree, a Shirley landmark, going back at least 150 years (maybe more) has to be destroyed.

In Lidl's application in 2016, details were provided that indicated the old tree would be protected and retained. In their 2017 reapplication they maintain that the tree will have to be removed. Strange as that this later application contained a detailed arboreal reporting that the tree was classed as an A rated, historical tree, unique in the area.

The developers state that the Yew tree will "spoil" the line of their store frontage. No defence in my book.

The Yew tree and the accompanying old milestone in front of it are as close to the boundary with the pavement in Shirley Road as they can be.


I sincerely hope you can do your utmost to impress on the developers and council members and officers involved that this much loved tree is protected and retained.





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My two Millbrook ward councillor colleagues will separately contact you in response to the proposals by Lidl to develop a new store on the site of the former depot and Shirley Police Station.

I have engaged with many members of the public in recent weeks, through door knocking, emails, letters, during a public meeting (approximately 80 attendees) undertaken on the 31st August at St Boniface Church Hall. My Labour Councillor colleagues and I also gave residents an opportunity to complete feedback forms to indicate their views on the proposals.

Broadly the majority of those local residents who responded or were questioned supported the proposed new store, however, the following comments, issues and concerns were raised during the engagement undertaken:

- 1. Traffic and highways impact This was the issue that was raised most often with me, and specifically the following points were raised:
 - a. The road surface of Villiers Road is unacceptable and would need to be resurfaced;
 - b. Concerns were raised regarding the customer vehicles entering and exiting the store, the junction of Villiers Road is not seen as suitable to allow cars to exit smoothly on to Shirley High Street, due to the level of existing users on the road. This would therefore force customers to use the existing 'ratrun' of Heysham Road and English Road. Due to the nature of Heysham Road and English Road, which are already congested, an increase in users on this road would not only negatively impact the lives of those residents living on this road, but also on safety. Concerns were also raised about the

- extant planning permission on the redevelopment of the gym site opposite, this will also put a large number of new cars and requirement for parking on to local roads.
- c. Concerns were also raised regarding cycling and cyclists using the Shirley High Street, residents and stakeholders felt this was already a dangerous road they were therefore keen to see cycling lanes introduced to reduce potential danger to cyclists;
- d. A larger store would either need more deliveries or larger lorries, both solutions were felt to be unsatisfactory, particular concerns were raised regarding lorries gaining access via English Road and Heysham Road;
- e. Concern was also raised that the development of the store would lead to an increase of on-street parking on the road that will border the new store;
- 2. Building line The building line of the store on Shirley High Street was raised by many as an area of concern. If the existing building line of Shirley High Street was to be maintained, the resulting loss of the Yew Tree and moving of the 'Mile Stone' was seen by many as unacceptable. If the existing building line of the police station was to be maintained, the possibility of creating a new bus stop lay-by set slightly back off the road was suggested. It was also suggested that a seating area fronting onto Shirley High Street, could benefit the area as well as a pedestrian access point onto Shirley was also recommended;
- 3. An unsatisfactory loss of protected trees with TPO's;
- 4. Works traffic, noise, dust and impact during demolition and construction was raised by many particularly in the vicinity of the store;
- 5. Shopping Trolley security, concern about trolleys being dumped in the vicinity of the store was often raised;
- 6. Concerns were raised about the traffic survey that formed part of the application, particularly the classification of old store traffic as discounted trips;
- 7. Light and noise pollution from the car-park, many concerns raised regarding high lampposts shining into peoples gardens and houses. Low level lighting was requested by many;
- 8. Potential anti-social behaviour in the car-park was also raised, out of hours locked gates on the car park were requested;
- 9. The wall that currently exists at the end of the gardens on Mayflower Road, needs to be replaced, if the existing wall is removed;
- 10. Air quality is already a big local issue, it was felt that Lidl could do a lot more to make the store more environmentally friendly.

Other issues raised which are unconnected to this application were also raised, namely:	

- 1. The future of the existing store site.
- 2. Lidl and their treatment of staff.

In my summing up, I broadly accept the principle of developing a new Lidl Store on the site and I feel the site lends
itself well to a retail development, however, I share the vast majority of the concerns detailed above, particularly
those related to the 'traffic and highways impact' (Point 1) and building line (Point 2).



Subject: Feedback from Lidl consultation period

Dear Sam, and officers,

Following the consultation period offered in regard to the proposed Lidl relocation, here is the feedback from residents who have contacted me directly, either by email or as part of a series of household canvassing sessions conducted by myself and my Millbrook ward colleagues.

Overall, there was considerable support, in principal, for the proposal but several significant concerns were raised. In the main, these were based on traffic and noise issues plus some specific comments about the proposed removal of protected trees and the historic milestone that are located in the site.

Substantial or detailed comments have been copied at the end of this email for reference.

To summarise, I personally received 15 emails.

2 of these expressed wholehearted support of the application

3 of these specified road/traffic concerns

3 of these were solely concerned about the loss of the yew tree and other protected trees

3 of these expressed combined concerns about road and tree issues

4 of these expressed other concerns (including broader environmental concerns and worries about the effect on smaller independent retailers in the area

Cllrs Denness, Furnell and I canvassed streets in the area potentially most immediately affected by the proposed move. The feedback I received from this canvassing mirrors many of the views expressed at the meeting held on August 31st. In general, residents were very supportive of the move but were extremely concerned about the impact on residential roads adjacent to the proposed store site. Equally, a number of residents felt the loss of protected trees, the yew tree in particular, and the milestone, would be very detrimental to the heritage of the locality.

As a Millbrook resident myself, I too support the proposal, in principle, but agree with much of the feedback I have received that traffic and road use issues are significant as they could lead to serious problems for those who live close to the site and, more generally, for road users and pedestrians in the area.

I also feel that air, light and noise pollution that may result from the move must be acknowledged and that the Lidl application has not yet addressed these with sufficient detail or sensitivity.

I would also appreciate some indication of Lidl's intentions to 'give back' to the community. Should a new store be approved, it would no doubt be of considerable benefit to the company. The location of the store affects 3 local wards (Millbrook, Shirley and Freemantle) that have significant areas of deprivation and community groups that require help. I would very much welcome a dialogue with interested parties in this matter to explore how Lidl could use their greater profile in these communities to support and promote voluntary and charitable organisations and events.

EMAILED COMMENTS FROM RESIDENTS:

I am quite happy for the Lidl development to go ahead but I with the following comments considered.

1. The ancient Yew tree (subject to TPO) in front of the Police Station cannot be removed - it and the historic milestone are of important historic value to Shirley. The development can continue quite easily with the tree in place - it should positively embrace it!

There is needle and berry fall - only a shame our council road sweepers, based in the council yard around the corner, couldn't have given them a regular clean-up. Lidl can do it now, please.

NB. The Yew tree is, in a way, symptomatic of the councils total ignorance of its responsibility to the trees that it is responsible for. The council's attitude seems to be that the trees are ignored until they fall into a dangerous condition when they can cut them down.

There are many trees in the Shirley area heavily infested with mistletoe! The odd bit of mistletoe is quite attractive but it must be controlled before it kills the tree. This could be a nice little earner for someone every Christmas, go on a harvest and sell it in the precinct.

- 2. My garden is perfectly quiet right now Lidl plans show an electrical substation next to my boundary wall, unless this substation is absolutely silent, I would prefer it was located further away from my boundary.
- 3. Traffic leaving the Lidl car park should be made to turn left onto Shirley High Street and not allowed to increase the heavily congested Heysham Road just like the traffic leaving Easy Gym/ Post Office with the signage and road design not shown on Lidl drawings.

I cannot see any good coming from having the two access ways opposite each other - I can only see the development of a traffic black-spot!

Access to Shirley High Street would be improved by the creation of two lanes for traffic turning left and right.

Shirley High Street is heavily congested at the best of times. The council should be pro-active in this area and be trying to reduce the traffic in Shirley and make every attempt at improving traffic flow. The recent changes to the traffic priorities where Regent Park Road join the High Street and the traffic light timing have greatly worsened traffic flow - more vehicles stopped and pushing out exhaust fumes. The situation is made works by an excess of busses along the High Street competing for the same passengers. The removal of the bus lay-bys in the previous 'improvements' also adds to the problem. When busses stop to pick-up passengers the road is brought to standstill.

This development will provide additional footfall and a bus lay by would help to ease traffic movement. The buses will not have a problem pulling out into to moving traffic - bus drivers are quite adept at pushing their way in!

- 4. Every time an articulated vehicle exits Villiers road and turn right on Shirley High Street it rides over the pedestrian crossing island opposite St Boniface Church this island will have to be moved further along the road.
- 5. Villiers Road is in an abysmal condition a great advert for the road outside the council maintenance yard! I trust this development will provide a new heavy duty surface.
- 6. Below this site is a Bronze / Iron age settlement I trust this will be sensitively excavated to reveal what treasures may be there?

- 7. There are many buildings of heritage value on this site please investigate the possibilities of salvaging them to give them good homes.
- 8. Villiers Road would greatly be improved with the addition of a pedestrian crossing it can be quite hazardous to cross it now before the addition of any traffic from Lidl.

There has been lots of talk of traffic, the yew tree and we had a positive meeting last night re ideas for better cycling access to the proposed Lidl (our collaborative cycle report to be forwarded to you soon). However, I'm not sure how much local discussion has happened around the retail impact of this larger store? As well as loss to the main supermarket chains, £0.4million will be lost from smaller shops on Shirley High Street, a number of which are independently owned. A further £0.3m lost from outside Shirley. I'm not concerned about the loss to Sainsburys or Tescos, but there is a problem with indies struggling as a result of international chains coming into and dominating the city.

Para 4.18 of Retail Statement "We assume that all the existing Lidl's trade will transfer across to the new store, which leaves £2.1m of additional turnover to be diverted from other shops. This is a worst-case scenario since in practice the additional floorspace provided in the larger store will in part be used for qualitative improvements that will improve the shopping environment but may not result in an uplift in turnover. We estimate that £1.3m of this £2.1m will come from the Sainsbury store, £0.1m from the Tesco Express and £0.4m from other shops in the centre (which will include the Iceland). The remaining £0.3m is expected to come from stores outside Shirley. None of the resulting impacts are significant, with the highest being -6.9% on the Sainsbury. It should also be noted that the table excludes the Co-op on Shirley Road, which was included in the retail study but has since closed. The turnover of that store is likely to have been redistributed to other shops within the centre, which will assist in ameliorating any impact from the new Lidl."

The report is a bit insensitive when it says "none of the resulting impacts are significant". Independent businesses are struggling in Southampton. If a local shop, perhaps one of our international stores, closes as a direct result of Lidl's expansion it will be significant to the owners and their customers that value their various product lines. I would have liked to see much more of an assessment of the impact of the diversity of shopping options in Shirley. 0.4million is a large amount of spend. Many stores are operating on very narrow margins already.

Lidl's business model does not include a café, pharmacy, post office etc but it may be worth including a condition to ensure these are not able to be included at a later date or other activity which could further threaten the vitality and viability of the high street.

I'm not clear whether the new Coop on Foundry Lane has been factored into the equation, and whether the new Lidl will impact on viability of this store which is within good walking distance of lots of Freemantle residents, some of whom will drive if they have to go to Shirley Road for their convenience shopping. I would imagine this shop will suffer from Lidl's relocation.

I am working on the Creative Places project at the moment which is all about the independent spirit of the city, ensuring places that support creative and community activity can flourish. On a side note, there has been an increase recently in indie places asking for public support to ensure they are sustained e.g. the Hobbit, Joiners, Board in the City, the Art House, October Books (all outside your wards but I wonder which venue will be next?). This is partly a consequence of the evening economy being redirected to big chains via West Quay watermark, and we have had some sad closures of much loved places such as The Notes café and Dock of the Bay, not to mention many more than are not quite as well known in the city, but were well valued by their loyal customers.

The Council is under public pressure to support struggling indies with rate relief and demonstrate its commitment to the locally-owned economy.

Whilst I have no objection to the proposals for the new store itself, my concern is with the increase in the volume of traffic that it will generate in the local area.

I live in English Rd and this is already a very busy rat run to town to avoid Shirley High St traffic congestion. Vehicles come from the dual carriage way, and also the High St, via Regents Park Rd, Waterhouse Way, English Rd, Foundry Lane & often Villiers Rd. Villiers Rd itself is a very narrow road, difficult to navigate because of the parked vehicles and the sharp blind bend.

BAT is also on Waterhouse Way. It is a major employer, already generating a significant amount of traffic, including large, heavy commercial vehicles.

As there is a primary school on the corner of English Rd & Foundry Lane, traffic is particularly heavy on the school run. I do have concerns about pupil safety during these times if even more traffic is using this short cut to access the proposed Lidl store.

My objection to the planning application is based purely on the increased volume of traffic that it will generate in an already very busy area & of course, child safety.

Please do share my concerns at your meeting about this planning application.

We have received a letter from Lidle UK dated 11 August outlining their proposed relocation to the corner of Shirley Road/Villiers Road, Shirley. We cannot stress how strongly we object to this projected moved.

Villiers Road is very narrow and as you will know Shirley Road is, at most times of the day, extremely busy. We cannot see how Lidle's very large delivery lorries (and possibly other companies' vehicles) will negotiate the proposed only entrance there will be to the site from Villiers Road along with customer traffic. There is also a busy right turn into Shirley Avenue almost opposite the site. This stretch of Shirley Road becomes quickly congested when buses are parked at the bus stop directly outside the site and vehicles are turning right into Shirley Avenue and also trying to come out of Villiers Road.

Secondly, we object to the tree being removed from the front of the proposed site. There is very little that is pleasant about this area of Shirley now and the tree is a rather nice feature. We know Lidle have proposed compensating for the loss of trees by planting a "tree lined avenue on Villiers Road". Quite frankly this is a ridiculous proposal – would they not be more appreciated in Shirley Road/High Street?) It will only be a matter of time before the trees are either vandalised or damaged by delivery lorries/traffic.

Finally, there is an old milestone directly in front of the tree on Shirley Road giving the distance to Southampton and Romsey. Is this quirky little feature going to be preserved? There is no mention of it in Lidl's publicity letter or on their very detailed site plan. We have no idea how old this milestone is but we think it would be desperately sad to lose it, which given the cavalier way Southampton treats its heritage, is highly likely.

There really is no precedent for a supermarket of this size fronting directly onto Shirley Road. Sainsburys is the only other large supermarket in the area and they are off the main road in Shirley Precinct. We can see no reason for Lidls to move from their present site except to increase their profits.

I have serious concerns on the amount of extra traffic that your new store will generate, the junction of Shirley Road and Villiers Road is already a nightmare to get in and out of and Shirley High Street is always very busy. It is my belief that your traffic survey is flawed.

Firstly the survey has discounted the traffic that uses the existing store, well unless the existing store is turn into a park there will still be traffic using that building after Lidl have moved. Just because it is not Lidl's customers causing the traffic does not mean it should be discounted.

Secondly the survey show that the existing Lidl's car par is being used by customers using the Polish supermarket. I believe this will happen on a bigger scale at the proposed site, people will use Lidl's car park and go in other shops generating more traffic than predicted.

Thirdly the survey cites a store in Ringwood against a proposed store in Southampton. The population density and infrastructure of the two places are completely different, this is a meaningless comparison.

I would also like to say that it is a disgrace that the tree on Shirley Road is removed, it has been there a very long time and it still looks in very good health.

Also I can find no reference in the proposal to the distance marker stone at the base of the tree, I think this is a datum point, a feature of Shirley and should be preserved in the place it stands today.

I have read the proposed development planning application and the documents that were posted to local residents.

I too share the concerns of recent articles in the Southern Daily Echo, regarding the traffic and congestion in Villiers Road/Shirley Road, and the impact the proposals would have to the local area.

My main objection and concern however, is in regards to the removal of the trees from the sight which are subject to Tree Preservation Orders. Most notably the Yew tree and mile marker which stand at the front of the sight. Why can't the proposal be changed in order for the trees to be kept?! All they need to do is step the front of the store back slightly to allow the Yew tree to remain. This tree has been there for an awful long time, and is a beloved fixture of the street scene! I do feel that the company have not taken into account the true feelings of the locals into account. Why allow for planting along the side of the store in Villiers Road, when it faces a car park for the gym and postal sorting office?! It does not make sense to have it this way. Plant the trees along the front and allow the Yew to remain!

I feel like putting up a banner "SAVE OUR YEW TREE!", or picketing the site to prevent its removal! Whilst Lidl may need a new site, the move onto the High Street in Shirley will have a detrimental effect on local independent shops. There are also supermarkets within very close distance (Sainsbury's), Tesco Express.

Two stores on the same stretch of road have closed, Co-op and Morrisons (which was situated very near to the suggested site). I also believe that the site, although needs to be developed, is crying out for housing, and some small shops facing onto Shirley Road, to carry on the 'local feel' of the High Street/Road with smaller shops. Also the traffic turning in and out of Villiers Road will increase, and lorries delivering to Lidl will be competing with lorries delivering mail to the Royal Mail sorting centre. The junction cannot be widened enough to cope with these heavy vehicles and traffic would need preventing access from Villiers Road into Heysham Road, residential roads and parking is bad enough in those roads at the moment as It is. Particularly at school times when I believe traffic increases a great deal, and as these roads lead directly to a school it could also cause even further issues.

The yew tree in front of the store is obviously a recognised landmark and valued by local residents, it also has a TPO. It is part of the furniture of the High Street and should not be removed.

Lidl obviously need a new site, but I don't believe this is the right place for it. A development of housing, and small shops, and possibly a children's play park and green planting would be far better for Shirley business, and it's residents.

As a resident of Freemantle and regular Lidl customer, I received a letter this morning showing me the proposed plans for the new Lidl store.

I do think this is a much needed upgrade and do support the new store opening.

Although, I do not support the removal of the Yew tree that is situated on Shirley Road, this is an iconic part of the high street and would be very upset to see it go.

I believe that this could be incorporated into the plans so that the store can still be built and the tree can also stay. When the police station was built in 1970 they incorporated the tree so why can't Lidl?

The tree is more iconic to the people of Southampton than the brand, and would only contribute to the image not take away from it. I feel so strongly about this matter that if the site is built and tree is removed or damaged I will no longer be using Lidl.

I hope that there will be some solution that both can be incorporated and I will look forward to visiting the new store.


While I welcome the re-development of the old Shirley Police Station site by Lidls, I am concerned that the old Yew tree, a Shirley landmark, going back at least 150 years (maybe more) has to be destroyed.

In Lidl's application in 2016, details were provided that indicated the old tree would be protected and retained. In their 2017 re-application they maintain that the tree will have to be removed. Strange as that this later application contained a detailed arboreal reporting that the tree was classed as an A rated, historical tree, unique in the area.

The developers state that the Yew tree will "spoil" the line of their store frontage. No defence in my book.

The Yew tree and the accompanying old milestone in front of it are as close to the boundary with the pavement in Shirley Road as they can be.

I sincerely hope you can do your utmost to impress on the developers and council members and officers involved that this much loved tree is protected and retained.

Re: REF: Planning Application 17/01206/FUL - Lidl, Shirley Road

My two Millbrook colleagues will be contacting you separately with the reactions of the constituents who have contacted them.

In general the emails I have received from residents has been supportive of the building of a new LIDL store on the site. I haven't tallied up the number of people who have contacted me but it has been a substantial number. I have also been contacted by many Southampton residents outside the boundaries of the Millbrook ward primarily because of the wide ranging letter which LIDL sent to most of the west side of the city. Myself and my Millbrook colleagues talked to dozens of the residents in the immediate vicinity of the proposed store and I also took notes at our public meeting on August 31st to gauge what people were saying. A small minority of residents completely opposed the building of a new store and wanted housing built on the side instead but as I say a very small minority.

There were two main concerns which a large majority of respondents mentioned:

The trees – primarily the old Yew tree on Shirley High St. People were vehemently against
this tree being removed as it is seen as an historical tree and as it is on the pavement it
would not interfere with the operations of a LIDL store. This tree should be kept and LIDL
told to change their plans. Two of the other three trees have a TPO and every effort should

- be made to keep these trees intact. LIDL should be asked to go away and rethink the siting of their store for this reason. Also the milestone should be kept.
- 2. Traffic Shirley Rd/Shirley High Street are very busy roads and a new store will add to the amount of traffic. The entrance and exit to the store is in Villiers Road. Villiers Road is already heavily used as there is the Royal mail depot and the Eazy gym opposite the proposed site. Villiers Road is also used as a rat run by cars to access Shirley from the houses through Heysham Rd and the housing towards Waterhouse Lane/English Rd/Regents Park Rd. The junction of Villiers Road with Heysham is a narrow dog leg and is difficult to manoeuvre. The road surface in Villiers Road is in a very bad state and needs resurfacing. The LIDL representative at the public meeting mentioned this so any scheme will need to take this into account. Maybe as part of any section 106 agreement LIDL would provide the money to do this. There has also been a suggestion that Villiers Road be closed by the last house so making it a cul de sac and stopping through traffic. I would like traffic engineers to consider this proposal.

These have been the two main topics raised by my constituents but other things have also been raised which are very valid concerns:

Make sure parking is only for shoppers not commuters. There is a lack of parking in this general area and residents are concerned about increased parking by commuters

Height of walls on Heysham Rd and Mayflower Rd. The boundary of the site will be at the back of the houses in Heysham Road and Mayflower road. Residents in these roads expressed concerns about the security of their properties as their houses would be open to potential burglars and intruders. Obviously at present there is limited access. Also people in Mayflower Road wanted the present back wall kept and not demolished.

The lights in the car park should be at a lower level to avoid shining into people's houses.

A resident said that the plans included an electrical substation directly against their wall ,he wanted it moved

Traffic should be directed to turn towards Shirley Rd on exiting the site to avoid driving into the housing estate.

Is there an Iron Age/Bronze Age settlement underneath the site, if so needs to be investigated. Noise and disturbance during demolition and construction and hours of work. There should be strict conditions on work carried out to demolish the site. Workers should be asked to park on site not in adjoining roads. In addition deliveries once the store is built should also be restricted.

LIDL should take responsibility to avoid litter and make it difficult for people to take away shopping trollies.

There should be extensive cycling provision on the site to encourage cycling.

Cllr Furnell Additional comments

I have some additional things which have not been raised by residents but which I would like to add The plans show an empty roof. This is an ideal opportunity for LIDL to show environmental concern and install solar panels on their roof. I noticed that they have done this in other stores in Europe. LIDL should recycle rain water to use in the store.

Installation of several electric charge points so shoppers can charge their vehicles whilst shopping. This is future proofing their store as this technology takes off in the next few years.

I am sure that other things will be fed into the discussion but I think I have included everything I have been told by residents during our consultation.

My two Millbrook ward councillor colleagues will separately contact you in response to the proposals by Lidl to develop a new store on the site of the former depot and Shirley Police Station.

I have engaged with many members of the public in recent weeks, through door knocking, emails, letters, during a public meeting (approximately 80 attendees) undertaken on the 31st August at St Boniface Church Hall. My Labour Councillor colleagues and I also gave residents an opportunity to complete feedback forms to indicate their views on the proposals.

Broadly the majority of those local residents who responded or were questioned supported the proposed new store, however, the following comments, issues and concerns were raised during the engagement undertaken:

- 1. Traffic and highways impact This was the issue that was raised most often with me, and specifically the following points were raised:
 - a. The road surface of Villiers Road is unacceptable and would need to be resurfaced;
 - b. Concerns were raised regarding the customer vehicles entering and exiting the store, the junction of Villiers Road is not seen as suitable to allow cars to exit smoothly on to Shirley High Street, due to the level of existing users on the road. This would therefore force customers to use the existing 'rat-run' of Heysham Road and English Road. Due to the nature of Heysham Road and English Road, which are already congested, an increase in users on this road would not only negatively impact the lives of those residents living on this road, but also on safety. Concerns were also raised about the extant planning permission on the redevelopment of the gym site opposite, this will also put a large number of new cars and requirement for parking on to local roads.
 - c. Concerns were also raised regarding cycling and cyclists using the Shirley High Street, residents and stakeholders felt this was already a dangerous road they were therefore keen to see cycling lanes introduced to reduce potential danger to cyclists;
 - d. A larger store would either need more deliveries or larger lorries, both solutions were felt to be unsatisfactory, particular concerns were raised regarding lorries gaining access via English Road and Heysham Road;
 - e. Concern was also raised that the development of the store would lead to an increase of on-street parking on the road that will border the new store;
- 2. Building line The building line of the store on Shirley High Street was raised by many as an area of concern. If the existing building line of Shirley High Street was to be maintained, the resulting loss of the Yew Tree and moving of the 'Mile Stone' was seen by many as unacceptable. If the existing building line of the police station was to be maintained, the possibility of creating a new bus stop lay-by set slightly back off the road was suggested. It was also suggested that a seating area fronting onto Shirley High Street, could benefit the area as well as a pedestrian access point onto Shirley was also recommended;
- 3. An unsatisfactory loss of protected trees with TPO's;
- 4. Works traffic, noise, dust and impact during demolition and construction was raised by many particularly in the vicinity of the store;
- 5. Shopping Trolley security, concern about trolleys being dumped in the vicinity of the store was often raised;
- 6. Concerns were raised about the traffic survey that formed part of the application, particularly the classification of old store traffic as discounted trips;
- 7. Light and noise pollution from the car-park, many concerns raised regarding high lampposts shining into peoples gardens and houses. Low level lighting was requested by many;
- 8. Potential anti-social behaviour in the car-park was also raised, out of hours locked gates on the car park were requested;
- 9. The wall that currently exists at the end of the gardens on Mayflower Road, needs to be replaced, if the existing wall is removed;
- 10. Air quality is already a big local issue, it was felt that Lidl could do a lot more to make the store more environmentally friendly.

Other issues raised which are unconnected to this application were also raised, namely:

- 1. The future of the existing store site.
- 2. Lidl and their treatment of staff.

In my summing up, I broadly accept the principle of developing a new Lidl Store on the site and I feel the site lends itself well to a retail development, however, I share the vast majority of the concerns detailed above, particularly those related to the 'traffic and highways impact' (Point 1) and building line (Point 2).

There are plenty of info sources out there for additional evidence, but I appreciate you said to keep this within the info from our meetings – if you were interested seek out the 20 is plenty campaign and also some reports by Edinburgh Council and Westminster Council as studies showed improved air quality when 20mph zones used as opposed to traffic calming which does increase pollution.

Evidence for 20mph limits from within our meetings:
18th Sept
A residents perspective – remember well in excess of our expectations in terms of replies: Lowering Speed Limits including to 20mph was identified by residents answering the survey.
WDCF recommended a number of measures to improve air quality including – Reduce speed limit to 40mph on Millbrook Road and 20mph around schools and side streets
20th Nov
It is worth taking on board this outcome:"
"safety of the roads for cyclists during normal usage. It was agreed that work was still needed to make the City's roads safer."
Although this does not state through 20mph limits, other Council gathered evidence from outside the panel itself i.e. the Pell Frischmann – Southampton City Wide Regeneration Framework Maybush and Millbrook residents survey document April 2014 - did show a majority of respondents saying they would consider modal shift if lower traffic speed limits existed.
To me this indicates a reduction in residential speed limits would help towards modal shift and therefore reduced car journeys and better air quality.
did state speed limit reductions would have little impact on emissions levels – however little impact is not zero impact. We should be looking at all ways to improve air quality at this stage, the arguments on where the priorities should then be are not for us as a panel. It is also worth noting that residents say lower speed limits would lead to modal shift.

Please note too, that clause 5.1.3 has been modified to refer to your client not "nominating" as opposed to "designating" any buildings on the site to be listed. As we discussed, this is a non-negotiable point from my client's perspective. Accordingly, a covenant in respect of this must also remain in the TR1. On the subject of the TR1, as we discussed, I have added some wording which I hope will be uncontroversial and which have been agreed by PCC in their TR1.


