Dear Mr Kerr,

Thank you for your email of 2nd December requesting the following information:

I believe my vehicle, Land Rover Defender 110 - N839 SFH, was employed in Merseyside for the MOD, I am keen to get to know what this vehicle has been doing especially as it was built 1995 and 1st registered in 2004, can you enhance this data for my vehicle history please.

I can confirm I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Unfortunately the Ministry of Defence (MOD) requires further information in order to determine whether it holds any information within the scope of your request as that provided currently only includes the civilian registration, which is not held in the MOD vehicle database

Ideally, it would be most useful to know the military registration which will comprise six characters, either in the format of *nn-aa-nn* or *aa-nn-aa*, or alternatively, the vehicle chassis number.

Once you have clarified your request, I will be pleased to consider it again.

Please remember to quote the reference number above in any future communications.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal
