Thank you for your email of 9 October 2021 in which you requested the following information

"Please send me a copy of ALL communications regarding the proposed development at Marden between 1st August 2020 and today, between Network Rail (you) and the "proposers" (DHA Planning/DHA Transport, and Countryside Properties)."

I have processed your request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR). The EIR, like the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), allows people to access information held by public authorities, like Network Rail. When people ask for environmental information, we need to consider the request under the EIR rather than the FOIA.¹ Information on vegetation maintenance meet(s) the definition of environmental information at Reg.2(1)(c) of the EIR² because works like this are a measure affecting the landscape, which is to say '...an area of land whose character and appearance has resulted from the interaction of natural or human factors'.

I can confirm that we hold recorded information that meets your request; please find attached 18 emails that list our correspondence between us and DHA Planning/DHA transport and Countryside properties. Within the 18 emails we have also attached the following 6 attachments.
