In relation to questions 3-12 of your request, the University withholds this information under Section 43 of the FOIA as it is likely to be prejudicial to its ability to participate competitively in a commercial market. We have conducted a balancing test of the public interests and concluded that in this instance the weight of the public interest is in favour of withholding.
