## Freedom of Information Act 2000

Your request has been considered under the provisions of the above legislation. Specifically, you have requested the following information:

What lawful basis under GDPR 2018 is used for processing data from individuals for enforcing council tax.

Croydon Council in common with other local authorities in England & Wales have a legislative obligation to collect Council Tax and which extends to enforcement action as may be necessary in the event of non-payment.

Council tax legislation which governs and require the administration and collection of Council Tax are set out in the Local Government Finance Act 1992, the Council Tax (Administrative and Enforcement) Regulations 1992 and associated legislation and regulations.

The General Data Protection Regulation as enacted in UK legislation through the Data Protection Act 2018 introduces a range of measures governing the processing of data. In this instance, Article 6 of GDPR addresses the lawfulness of processing, and specifically Article 6 (1) © which states that -

"Processing shall be lawful only if and to the extent that at least one of the following applies:

(c) processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the controller is subject;"

As Croydon Council has a statutory obligation to administer and collect Council Tax -

including associated enforcement - under the Local Government Finance Act 1992, the Council Tax (Administration and Enforcement) Regulations and associated legislation and regulations, this legislation places a legal obligation on the Council and as such the processing of data is therefore lawful and in accordance with the provisions of Article 6 (1) (c) as detailed above.
