Freedom of Information Request

Thank you for your e-mail of 18 January requesting information under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You asked:

I am asking for clarification on whether the DVLA has legal rights over the registered keeper of the vehicle with regards to who claims ownership? Can you please attach any information on how to legally claim ownership if this is the case

The information requested is not held. DVLA is responsible for recording the registered keeper of vehicles, not the legal owner. Therefore, we cannot become involved in any disputes over ownership.
