<sup>1</sup> Under the FoIA any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled to be informed in writing whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and, if that is the case, to have the information communicated to him. There are a number of situations when information which a public authority holds is exempt from this requirement. In particular, information is exempt information if its disclosure (otherwise than under the FoIA) by the public authority holding it:

- is prohibited by or under any enactment
- is incompatible with any community obligation, or
- would constitute or be punishable as a contempt of court.

The duty to confirm or deny whether the public authority holds information does not arise in these circumstances.

If, following such an appeal, you are still not satisfied you have the right to appeal to the Information Commissioner under Section 50 of the FoIA 2000. There is no charge for making an appeal to the Information Commissioner.
