- (c) explain the reasons why you are dissatisfied with our response

If you remain dissatisfied with how your request for information has been dealt with, you also have the right, in terms of section 47 of FOISA and section 17 of the EIRs, and within 6 months, to apply to the Scottish Information Commissioner for a decision as to whether we have handled your request properly.
