Thank you for your request, which was received on 13 January, for the following information:

“Can you tell me how many people within the constituency of Welwyn Hatfield have been sent letters from HMRC regarding so called "disguised remuneration"? In other words, how many people in Welwyn Hatfield have been contacted by HMRC with regards to the 2019 Loan Charge? How many people will the 2019 Loan Charge affect within Welwyn Hatfield?”

HMRC is actively encouraging Disguised Remuneration (DR) scheme users impacted by the charge on DR loans to come forward and settle their tax affairs with us before the charge on DR loans arises on 5 April 2019. We have written to over 40,000 DR scheme users.
