





EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDERS – PROPOSED LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOODS

The London Borough of Newham proposes to make experimental traffic orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Before we make the orders you are being consulted as required under the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996.

The London Borough of Newham (LBN), as the local highway and public health authority, has established policies to increase sustainable travel and reduce the impact of motorised transport on public health (physical activity, air quality, road traffic collisions, noise, severance) and on the climate emergency.

This includes projects that contribute to the principal aim of the Mayor of London's Transport Strategy (2018) to reduce private car use and increase the use of sustainable modes (walking, cycling and public transport) to 80% of all trips by 2041.

The context of the COVID-19 pandemic has further added to the need to address unsustainable travel patterns, with the need to maximise physical distancing adding to the existing strong public health case for interventions.

Under normal circumstances Newham residents make the highest proportion of trips by public transport of any borough in London (39%), excluding the City of London, and less than half of Newham households have access to a car.

As such, there is an identified need to rapidly accelerate delivery of projects to deliver better conditions for, and incentivise, walking and cycling as a viable alternative wherever possible.

Reducing exposure to motor traffic, and incentivising walking and cycling, can be achieved through the introduction of 'low traffic neighbourhoods' (LTNs).

LTNs utilise road closures, with exemptions for cycles, known as 'modal filters' to reduce or eliminate through motor traffic from a defined residential area and incentivise walking and cycling.

Please find attached proposals for the experimental introduction of two proposed LTNs in the London Borough of Newham. These proposals have been developed in consultation and partnership with the London Borough of Waltham Forest, as the neighbouring authority, but specifically relate to those measures within the London Borough of Newham:

- Area 1 'Chobham', in the north part of Stratford, bounded by the A112 Leyton Road, Crownfield Road (in the London Borough of Waltham Forest), Leytonstone Road, and the Great Eastern Mainline railway; comprising of the introduction of:
 - five proposed road closures, of which three are proposed with exemption for emergency services via the use of lockable bollards and two are proposed as fixed.
 - o one-way working on one street
 - localised parking and loading restrictions and suspension/relocation of parking bays
- Area 2 'Odessa', in the north west part of Forest Gate, bounded by Leytonstone Road, Cann Hall Road (in the London Borough of Waltham Forest), the B161 Dames Road, and Forest Lane; comprising of the introduction of:
 - seven proposed road closures, of which two are proposed with exemption for emergency services via the use of lockable bollards and five are proposed as fixed.
 - o the conversion of one street from one-way operation to two-way operation
 - localised parking and loading restrictions and suspension/relocation of parking bays

The proposals are presented in:

Please note, locations marked in yellow are proposed with exemption for emergency services via the use of lockable bollards; and that closures within the London Borough of Waltham Forest are shown indicatively and will be consulted on by that authority at a later date, subject to funding.



Thanks for your time yesterday to further discuss the proposed low traffic neighbourhoods in Newham.

I've just made a few notes of our discussion:



- We discussed that cameras for ANPR enforcement would not be available until October at the earliest.
- We discussed if third party footage of moving traffic contraventions (section 3 and/or 36 of the RTA 1988), such as a driver going through a signs-only modal filter, could be uploaded to the Met online reporting tool (https://www.met.police.uk/ro/report/rti/rti-a/report-a-road-traffic-incident/) for enforcement.
- We discussed that it was the intention of LBN Members/Management to proceed with the 12 modal filters as proposed in some form, and to work with you on any potential amendments/actions to help achieve the scheme objectives (a high rate of compliance), with the proposed timeline:
 - o Communications to all residents: Friday 17th July
 - o Start date of experimental order advertisement: Wednesday 22nd July
 - o First possible implementation date: 30th July

In terms of actions:

1. I would send screenshots of example 'access only' areas of our proposed LTNs, please find these attached for area 2. Please find these attached (extracted from this map as previously shared):

3. You would investigate if the online reporting tool could be used for drivers contravening signs-only modal filters.

I am conscious of the time and have had no response to my questions regarding the Idmiston/Buckingham junction.

Please see my attached response form which shows the below concerns. Also note that any concerns the designing out crime and/or counter terrorism officers have sent to you directly should also be considered. As these are experimental closures I would hope that any future issues we get around response times or ASB calls be considered in any review before making permanent changes.

- 1. The point closures in Bow Street and Henniker Road are very close to Leytonstone Road giving them the potential to create pockets of Anti-social behaviour.
- 2. The diagonal closure point at the Idmiston/Buckingham Roads junction narrows the carriageway and opposing vehicles may have difficulty passing at this point if no priority given. Note that plans seen by Police do not have road widths nor any alterations to any give way markings shown.

Thank-you for the telephone call alerting me to my omission!

As discussed – now addressing just the Newham portion of Area 2:-

- 1. The Bow Street closure is adjacent to the High Road which increases the potential for ASB as highlighted by the DOCO officers.
- 2. The closure points, as they stand, at Field Road, Odessa Road and Buckingham Road will prevent active patrolling of the area by officers and also hinder them from getting to calls as these are key roads they use to get across the borough.

As such, the Met Police object to these closures as they stand on the grounds of public safety and would request that consideration be given to having these camera enforced and emergency vehicles permitted.

Further, to the below: my only concerns for Windmill Lane, if only the eastern end closure point remained, would be on the grounds of ASBO as highlighted by the DOCO.

Hello

Regarding this proposal; as well as my own views I also sought those of our Designing Out Crime Team and also the borough officers via their Chief Inspectors. As you can see from the attached both of them raise public safety concerns regarding the modal filters through which we will not have access. Highlighting the proximity to transport hubs ie Stratford and Maryland and also the problems around a similar scheme in Hoe Street. Leytonstone Road and Hoe Street could be considered to be very similar in nature and therefore a strong likelihood of introducing an anti-social behaviour hotspot along this road.



Of the current plan the only proposed modal filter that does not present a problem to policing is the one in Maryland Road.

If these are to be installed I would request that they are done using CCTV cameras and appropriate signage along with a traffic order permitting

emergency service vehicles to pass through. I appreciate that there is a cost implication with cameras, but have been informed that LBWF have recently purchased a number of suitable moveable ones and this morning I saw one in place enforcing a yellow box in Markhouse Road.

For the reasons stated above the Metropolitan Police formally object to the plans, on the grounds of public safety, in their current form.

This includes projects that contribute to the principal aim of the Mayor of London's Transport Strategy (2018) to reduce private car use and increase the use of sustainable modes (walking, cycling and public transport) to 80% of all trips by 2041.

The context of the COVID-19 pandemic has further added to the need to address unsustainable travel patterns, with the need to maximise physical distancing adding to the existing strong public health case for interventions.

Under normal circumstances Newham residents make the highest proportion of trips by public transport of any borough in London (39%), excluding the City of London, and less than half of Newham households have access to a car.

As such, there is an identified need to rapidly accelerate delivery of projects to deliver better conditions for, and incentivise, walking and cycling as a viable alternative wherever possible.

Reducing exposure to motor traffic, and incentivising walking and cycling, can be achieved through the introduction of 'low traffic neighbourhoods' (LTNs).

LTNs utilise road closures, with exemptions for cycles, known as 'modal filters' to reduce or eliminate through motor traffic from a defined residential area and incentivise walking and cycling.

Please find attached proposals for the experimental introduction of two proposed LTNs in the London Borough of Newham. These proposals have been developed in consultation and partnership with the London Borough of Waltham Forest, as the neighbouring authority, but specifically relate to those measures within the London Borough of Newham:

- Area 1 'Chobham', in the north part of Stratford, bounded by the A112 Leyton Road, Crownfield Road (in the London Borough of Waltham Forest), Leytonstone Road, and the Great Eastern Mainline railway; comprising of the introduction of:
 - five proposed road closures, of which three are proposed with exemption for emergency services via the use of lockable bollards and two are proposed as fixed.
 - o one-way working on one street
 - localised parking and loading restrictions and suspension/relocation of parking bays
- Area 2 'Odessa', in the north west part of Forest Gate, bounded by Leytonstone Road, Cann Hall Road (in the London Borough of Waltham Forest), the B161 Dames Road, and Forest Lane; comprising of the introduction of:
 - seven proposed road closures, of which two are proposed with exemption for emergency services via the use of lockable bollards and five are proposed as fixed.
 - o the conversion of one street from one-way operation to two-way operation
 - localised parking and loading restrictions and suspension/relocation of parking bays

The proposals are presented in:

- The following drawing, showing the overall plans for the locations of road closures, for area 1 and 2 respectively. Please note, locations marked in yellow are proposed with exemption for emergency services via the use of lockable bollards; and that closures within the London Borough of Waltham Forest are shown indicatively and will be consulted on by that authority at a later date, subject to funding.

The Henniker Road modal filter was always proposed at the junction with Leytonstone Road; the modal filter to the south (on Maryland Road) is at a mid-point.
Wooder Gardens has been shown as one-way on the public facing diagrams as the filter will be 'except for access' at the eastern end meaning residents on that street should still access from the east (as they currently do) but our intention is that it is effectively two-way for emergency vehicles.
I have copied in my colleague and will kindly ask her to provide an amended masterplan with the modal filters coloured as requested below.

Regarding the Buckingham Road closure, which will be signs-and-camera enforced, as attached, I understand the gap perpendicular to the east-west kerb line (so for vehicles proceeding straight along Buckingham Road) between the corners of the planters will be 3.1m and the gap if you slow and approach perpendicular to the planters is 5m. However, we will have a more accurate assessment once we have set out (likely next week) and I can provide an accurate update then.

At the Idmiston/Buckingham junction you are using a 512 bend ahead sign on what is, visibly, a straight road. Is this the correct sign for this situation? At the same junction what is the minimum width between the planter and the opposite corner? Ie how much room do opposing vehicles have to play with?

Have you considered deflections to slow these down if the gap is narrow?
