Dear Stephen Delahunty,

I write in response to the above-referenced Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request submitted on the 16<sup>th</sup> March 2018. Thames Valley Police has now considered this request, which for clarity, has been repeated below:

<u><b>Request</b></u>	<u><b>Response</b></u>
1.) The number of male domestic violence / abuse incidents that TVP attended in the Windsor and Maidenhead policing area between June 2016 and June 2017.	This request is being refused under <b>Section 12(1)</b> of the FOIA.
2.) What was the total number of victims?	Section 12 of the FOIA allows that public authorities do not have to comply with section 1(1) of the Act if the cost of complying would exceed the appropriate limit. In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act, this letter represents a Refusal Notice for this request.
3.) Of these cases, what was the outcome (was anyone charged / prosecuted)?	
4.) How many calls relating to domestic violence did the force receive the year before? (June 2015 - June 2016)	The information requested for question one (1) and four (4) is not held in an easily retrievable format and would require a manual search through call logs to establish the gender of the victim of the incident that officers had attended. To provide information for question four (4) would undertake the same process and therefore would exceed the appropriate 18 hour time and £450 cost limit.
Can I also get the same figures for the TVP Slough policing area please?	<b>Section 16:- Further advice &amp;</b>
