Dear Ian White,

Thank you for your Freedom of Information review request received on 17th November. You asked:

I find it inconceivable you do not hold these exact figures, when it is yourselves that administer the system. Please undertake an internal review!

DWP Response:

I am of a senior grade to the person who dealt with your request, I was not involved previously, and can confirm that I have carried out an internal review. I am now in a position to respond to you.

I am content that your original request was dealt with in accordance with DWP guidelines for FoI requests. The reasoning behind why information on the number of MRs which resulted in an increase or decrease in award, and the number increased following appeal is not available for PIP is as follows:

- The MR outcomes recorded by a DWP CM on the PIP Computer System are 'new decision changed,' 'new decision unchanged,' 'decision not revised.' or 'withdrawn.'
- The appeal outcomes recorded on the PIP Computer system are 'new decision changed,' 'new decision unchanged,' 'decision maintained,' 'appeal lapsed,' 'withdrawn pre HMCTS' or 'withdrawn post HMCTS'.
- To determine the direction of the change would require complex data matching that would take in excess of 5 working days and thus exceed the appropriate limit for central Government, set by regulations at £600. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 3½ working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting it.
- The data matching and extraction of the data requested would involve application of specialist knowledge to the manipulation of the raw data and high level of skill and judgement, which would amount to creating new information not already held by the Department.
