Response

The council holds the information requested and it is attached/ the answers to your

1a) What measures to date have been put in place by your local authority to encourage, increase and/or aid the uptake of electric vehicles and associated technology by residents within your local authority area? Please provide details of each measure.

Eight electric vehicle charge points have been provided by Barnet with Source London in public car-parks and on-street. (2 at Lodge Lane Car Park, 2 at Bunns Lane CarPark, 2 on-street in East Finchley, 2 on-street in Temple Fortune).

1b) Are any future measures being considered by your local authority to encourage, increase and/or aid the uptake of electric vehicles and associated technology by residents within your local authority area? If so, please provide details of each measure.

LBB has been awarded grant funding to install a number of charge points across the borough. With this funding we are looking to install a first tranche of 35 lamp column chargers across the borough to provide charging for residents with off street parking. In addition to this we are also installing charge points in Fitzjohn Car park, Moxon Street Car park, Stapylton Car Park, Stanhope Car park and also a new car park in Colindale which will provide for Car clubs as well as the public. Once this programme is complete there will be additional project to implement an increased offer of EV charging for residents and encourage them to use EV.

We are also implementing various car clubs that use EV, which should be available in the borough by the end of the summer.

2a) What measures to date have been put in place to encourage, increase and/or aid the uptake of electric vehicles and associated technology within your local authority fleet and amongst local authority staff? Please provide details of each measure.

We have 2 Renault Zoe's have been in operation since late October 2015 at Barnet House they are funded by a 10 months lease to E-car club being paid by the GLA Mayors air quality fund to promote electrical vehicle use and improve local air quality. We also have additional cars at North London business park to for staff use.

Through our programme to relocate to new office, we are working on providing EV pool cars to staff, so that they will be able to use EV for work purpose travel.

We have engaged with businesses on a limited basis, we have also engaged with other boroughs that have taken major steps to introduce electric vans to local businesses. The conclusion from this is that success has been fairly limited, we are awaiting the technology to improve before pursuing similar schemes in the borough.

The car clubs that are to be implemented in the coming months will be available for business use and the research suggests that is a popular use of the car club vehicles so we expect a significant uptake of the car clubs for business use.

There is a requirement for a percentage of parking places to have active and passive points to be provided in new developments.
