Dear A.J. Wilson,

Thank you for your Freedom of Information (FoI) request received on 18 February. You asked:

On February 5th 2020, "Gingerbread" reported on their social media that they had held a meeting with Baroness Stedman-Scott in relation to the Child Maintenance Service.

In relation to this meeting please provide the following under the Freedom of Information Act 2000:

- All communication between Baroness Stedman-Scott and Gingerbread since she was handed responsibility for the Child Maintenance Service to date.
- Any notes or handouts taken at or provided at the meeting on February 5th 2020.

## **DWP Response:**

I can confirm that we hold some information falling within the description specified in your request.

With regard to your first point there have been two other meeting with Gingerbread in addition to the meeting on 5 February 2020.

Baroness Stedman-Scott had a telephone call with Gingerbread Chief Executive Officer Victoria Benson on 11 September 2019 and attached are the written notes of that call.

The Baroness then had a meeting with Victoria Benson on 28 October 2019. Following a search of our electronic and paper records, I can confirm that the Department does not hold any documents or notes relating to this meeting.

In relation to the second part of your request, the briefing document which was written by Gingerbread has been attached. Please note that the Personal Information of certain Gingerbread employees and members of the public have been redacted. I am unable to provide you with all the information requested as it constitutes personal data of someone other than yourself and as such, it is being withheld in accordance with section 40(2) of the FOIA.

Section 40(2) exempts information in response to a request if it is personal data belonging to

an individual other than the requester and it satisfies one of the conditions listed in the legislation. In this case the condition contained in section 40(3A)(a) applies - that disclosure would breach one of the data protection principles, specifically that "Personal data shall be processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner...".

We do not consider that disclosing this information is necessary or justified in order to satisfy your information request and the requirements of the FOIA. In relation to this request, we consider that there is no strong legitimate interest that would override the prejudice to the rights and freedoms of the data subject.

Personal data are subject to GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018.
