People's Palace

Purpose

To explore the *principles and processes* to re-imagine the future of key city assets to deliver enhanced services to communities. And the benefits of new collaborative approaches in the context of changing city needs and challenging budgets

Contexts

Glasgow is a vibrant, changing city, re-positioning itself around 21st century economic sectors in creative industries, services and modern industries. The city is changing which brings new and different expectations of city resources, services and assets.

Glasgow City Council is experiencing significant challenge around its budgeting and resources, and the profiling of future investment and management of city services and assets.
