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


### 1. Introduction

The People's Palace is set in historic Glasgow Green. It is home to a collection of objects, photographs, prints and film which give a unique view into how Glaswegians lived, worked and played in years gone by to the present day.


### 2. Visitor profile

### 2.1 Area of residence

39% of all visitors to Peoples Palace reside within Glasgow, in line with visitors to Glasgow Museums overall (38%).



### Museum visitors by residence




### 2.2 Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD)

47% of Glaswegians live in SIMD Quintile 1 areas representing the 20% most deprived areas in Scotland.

A higher proportion of Glasgow visitors to Museums come from the most deprived areas (Quintile 1, 27%) compared to the least deprived areas (Quintile 5, 20%).

29% of Peoples Palace visitors reside within SIMD Quintile 1 areas representing 20% of the most deprived areas in Scotland. This is the highest of all Glasgow Museums and higher than the Glasgow Museums average (22% of total visitors and 27% of Glasgow visitors).





### 2.3 Repeat visits

47% of visitors to Peoples Palace are first time visitors, with 38% being repeat visitors and having visited previously within the last year. This is +16% higher than the Glasgow Museums average of 31% of visitor's visiting with the past year.

### 2.4 Visit motivation and duration

76% of visitors visit Peoples Palace specifically to visit the museum. The second highest reason is to use the café in neighbouring venue, The Winter Gardens (8%). The average visitor spends 89 minutes in the Peoples Palace, above the Glasgow Museum average (84 minutes).

### 2.5 Travel to museum

The main methods of transport used to get to each museum reflect the demographics of the visitors as well as the location of the museum itself.

The most popular mode of travel to Peoples Palace is by car (36%), below the Glasgow Museum average (41%). Walking is the second most popular method of travel to the People Palace (26%), the highest of all museums and 4% above the Museums average (22%).

An above average percentage of visitors (14%) also use a sightseeing/tour bus to visit Peoples Palace, double the Glasgow Museums average (7%).

### 2.6 Gender

Visitors to People Palace are more likely to be female (45%) than male (55%), in line with visitors to Glasgow Museums overall.

Visitors to Peoples Palace display an even spread of age ranges, in line with the Glasgow Museums visitors overall.

### 2.8 Ethnicity

Glasgow is the most ethnically diverse population in Scotland, with 12% of the population belonging to a non-white ethnic minority.

95% of visitors to Peoples Palace identify as being from a white Scottish, British, Irish or other white background. 5% of visitors are from non-white ethnic minorities, lower than the Glasgow Museums average (7%).


### 3. Performance

### 3.1 Visits

Visits to Peoples Palace are gradually increasing, averaging at 340,000 visits per year for the last 5 years. The Peoples Palace is the 4<sup>th</sup> most visited venue of all Glasgow Museums, behind Riverside (1<sup>st</sup>), Kelvingrove (2<sup>nd</sup>) and GoMA (3<sup>rd</sup>). Visitor numbers at Peoples Palace account for 9% of overall Glasgow Museum visits.


The number of visitors to the venue is often impacted by events on Glasgow Green. In 2016-17, the venue was subject to a number of short term closures due to Music events including Transmit and Bruno Mars and also due to a number of essential repairs taking place at adjoining venue, the Winter Gardens.

Prior to closure in December 2018, performance was recovering. The museum experienced a positive summer and a record August due to Festival 2018 which attracted a number of additional visitors to the live zone at Glasgow Green.




August is the most visited month at Peoples Palace, followed by July. In the last 10 years an average of 72,972 visits to Peoples Palace took place in July (36,054) and August (36,918). This accounts for an average of 25% of annual visits to Peoples Palace taking place in these months; July (12.3%) and August (12.6%).

### 3.2. School visits

Glasgow Museums offer facilitated school workshops designed to extend and enhance classroom learning. This comprehensive curriculum-linked programme for nursery, primary and secondary school groups is delivered across 9 Glasgow Museum venues.

The number of school visits to Museums is increasing year on year. In 2017-18 Glasgow Museums welcomed 49,076 school children on 1,954 visits, an increase of +13% on 2016-17).

School visits to Peoples Palace is also increasing and accounted for 11% of all Museum school visits in 2017-18.

### **Contexts**

Glasgow is a vibrant, changing city, re-positioning itself around 21st century economic sectors in creative industries, services and modern industries. 




