## reedom of Information Act 2000: lost and stolen equipment

hank you for your Freedom of Information enquiry of 23 June 2015.

ou asked for the following information –

"how many laptops and phones supplied to your employees have gone missing or been stolen within the last 36 months"

can confirm that HM Treasury does hold information in scope of your request up to 23 une 2015.

IM Treasury is now fully capable of remote working and all staff members have the authorisation to take ICT equipment out of the department, for example, to support exible working. Procedures are in place to ensure that Treasury IT devices are protected against unauthorised use including when the device is reported as lost or stolen

During the last 36 months, 23 laptops and 62 phones supplied to our employees have been reported as lost or stolen.

ome of the equipment reported as lost or stolen as detailed above were subsequently ecovered: 2 laptops and 5 mobiles.
