Dear Mr McLean

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 29 December 2016. You asked:

- a. How much money was actually saved by not paying the Winter Fuel Allowance to the UK pensioners who reside in France and Spain in the winter of 2014/15
- b. Why was Southern Ireland not declared a warm country as it's average winter temperature is actually higher than that of South West England

For the winter of 2014/15 Winter Fuel Payments were made to UK pensioners residing in France and Spain therefore no savings were made.

With regard to your question about average winter temperatures. The Government worked with the Met Office to develop as robust a methodology as possible, and to analyse comparable winter temperature data across all EEA countries. The report which I attach for your information shows the average temperature for Ireland to be 5.5°C which is colder than the average temperature for South West England which is 5.6°C.
