Following my earlier email and our telephone conversation with regard to the trials of monk parakeet control techniques, here is confirmation of how we shall proceed.

To assist in visualising the study area, the attached *[removed]* aerial photograph illustrates the location of known monk parakeet nesting sites in Borehamwood. [REDACTED] is the original release site, where birds escaped or were released from captivity. [REDACTED] is where [REDACTED]'s trials are taking place.

A second round of shooting trials will be undertaken at tree 3 in [REDACTED]. At the same time trials of the cage trap and whoosh net will be carried out in [REDACTED] of this property. The trials are

scheduled for the week commencing November 10th - this will need confirmation of the approval of the various interested parties, i.e. home-owner, local police and council.

This second round of trials and subsequent monitoring will exceed the original budget allocated to the work. The trials and subsequent monitoring of their effect will cost a further £7000.
