Thank you for your enquiry in reference to the announcement made by the Cabinet Secretary of Infrastructure, Investment and Cities, Keith Brown MSP, regarding the £254 million funding the Scottish Government will provide in Aberdeen City Region in addition to the £250 million Aberdeen City Region Deal. This investment will be targeted towards the delivery of improved transport, digital connectivity and local housing programmes.

£200 million of this funding will focus on opportunities to increase line speeds and remove major capacity constraints along the key sections of the route with a particular focus between Aberdeen and Dundee. This will include options for double tracking of Usan Junction and South Esk Viaduct at Montrose.

These works are planned to be delivered over the same 5-10 year time frame as the City Deal. Development of engineering options to address the constraints at Usan to Montrose are at the very early stages, and these will require further input from the rail industry to enable a robust and cost effective solution to be agreed and delivered.

At this stage we can state that the investment will help support better performance, improved journey times and increased capacity for passenger and freight services, including cross-border services.

A full break down of the £254 million Scottish Government investment is detailed below:

- An initial £200m to improve journey times and increase capacity on key rail links between Aberdeen and the Central Belt, including options for upgrading the rail line in the Montrose basin
- £24m for the trunk roads programme to support improvements to the key A90/A937 south junction at Laurencekirk
- £10m for extension of digital infrastructure in the Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire area above and beyond the commitment through the City Deal
- £20m in infrastructure funding to unlock housing sites that are of strategic importance to the local authorities as well as five-year certainty on £130m of affordable housing grant.
