Dear Peter,

I am writing in response to your Freedom of Information request, dated 1 February 2015, concerning motorcycle parking facilities at stations managed by East Coast.

The recorded information we hold concerning this request is below. Unless specified, the bays are within the station car park. With the exception of Wakefield Westgate, where the car park is managed by Wakefield City Council, no charges apply:

- Dunbar – 3 spaces all with security rails;
- Berwick upon Tweed – 2 spaces, no fixing devices;
- Newcastle Central – 1 large bay within short stay car park that will accommodate 3 to 4 motorcycles. There is another area used for motorcycles within the long stay car park that will also hold 3 to 4. There are no fixing devices in either designated areas;
- Durham – There is space for 8 motorcycles with a single security rail for all;
- Darlington – There is space for 8 motorcycles in the Victoria Road entrance to the station, under the portico. There are no fixing devices for these spaces;
- York – We can accommodate 26 motorcycles and have two security rails that can be used;
- Wakefield Westgate – there are 10 spaces within the council operated multi-storey car park. Normal car park rates apply;
- Doncaster – there are 3 security frames which hold a total of 6 motorcycles;
- Retford – 1 space, no fixing devices;
- Newark North Gate – 4 spaces, no fixing devices;
- Grantham – 6 spaces with security frames; and
- Peterborough – 80 spaces served by 20 different security rails.

I hope this response is helpful to you. If you are not satisfied with this response, you have the right to ask for a review. In the first instance you should contact me again to request this.
