A.6	<p>Creative Time An open discussion on relationships and what CSS does or should be doing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Chief Clinical Information Officer (CCIO) – what is it? Discussion about the role and need <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Clinical Champion of IT - the use of IT and information, its application in health and impact on efficiency and outcomes. Historically the Medical or Clinicl Director of providers have provided this leadership/interest national recognition (campaigned by e health insider and the British Computer Society) that Medical Director can't do everything and good for organisations to have formal clinical champions. Some organisations are creating roles some have identified more than 1 clinical champion of IT CSS and CCGs have identified clinical leads who are involved in and actively promote use of Information and IT, who can feed back information to the Clinicians. The Information and IT Steering group provides a forum where we can trust and share. The GP's would like CSS to give them as much technical help as possible, to ensure they have the best tools to deliver what they need too. It was agreed that anyone a CCIO type role should be about the application of IT and Information and working with the IT and Information specialists. IT was generally felt that at the moment we probably have the right balance of interest and involvement – especially given pace of change within CCGs and CSS

GPs though this should work. The ICT Programme Managers will support the CCGs in the planning and delivery of IT solutions to enable the QIPP plans. The approach reflects the Information approach with assigned Principal Analysts: At the time of the meeting the structure was going through an internal consultation. We are now pleased to announce that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Emma and Nicci Rosengarten (job share) have been assigned to Southampton CCG, West CCG and North CCG Chris Day will lead the IT programme for SE Hampshire CCG, F&G CCG and Portsmouth CCG North East Hampshire (Vacancy TBC) <p>IT support – Shared Services</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Andy reported that SHIP cluster (CSS and CCGs), Solent HC and Southern Health currently receive IT services provided by two ICT shared service organisations - Island and Portsmouth Health Informatics Service (IPHIS) and Hampshire IT Solutions (HITS). Recent discussions between the stakeholders and shared services concluded that current ICT arrangements were no longer meeting needs of the community service organisations and both have decided to take direct control of IT (either through direct provision or by out sourcing) This means that there is significant work to do to define and look at the options for CSS and CCGs. <p>Primary Care ICT The Department of Health has confirmed that it will delegate the responsibility for the provision of GP IT to CCGs.</p>

The process needs to be clarified. CP is creating a (new) policy document reflecting national guidelines that will be distributed and effective from 1 October 2012. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ We will be outlining how the budgets will be split and which/how items are funded. ○ We will ensure there is a single point of contact for any queries regarding the new bidding process from October 2012 and ensuring the 'needs' are transparent to all the CCG's. <p>Action CP to circulate policy doc to CCGs.</p>	CP
