## REQUEST UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

Further to your enquiry, which we received on 05 January 2018, you requested the following information:

I would like to know in an emergency front-line ambulance,

- 1) the reported decibels and vibration levels within the transporting ambulances rear and cab compartments.
- 2) If these are not recorded how is the estimated noise level recorded?
- 3) I would also like to know the steps taken to prevent hearing damage to staff, patients and paramedic students.
- 4) How exposure times are monitored for staff and paramedic students.
- 5) How the noise and vibration levels are monitored both initially and as vehicles age and in what conditions they are tested (I.e is the noise and vibration levels tested in a moving vehicle with all necessary front line ambulance equipment including stretcher?).
- 6) Also can you please advise the model and makes of vehicle tested for frontline transportation of patients.

## Response

Extensive independent testing has taken place, covering different daily exposure scenarios. That can be summarised by the following table:

Daily Exposure Conditions	Driver	Front Passenger	Rear Passenger
8hr/shift – 64 min Siren Usage	74.7	77.3	74.1
8hr/shift – 70 min Siren Usage	74.8	77.4	74.3
12hr/shift – 96 min Siren Usage	76.5	79	75.9
12hr/shift – 106 min Siren Usage	76.6	79.1	76.1

Should there be a significant change in the construction of the vehicle or parts utilised (Siren) then we will ensure further testing is carried out to ensure suitability and compliance with The Control of Noise at Work Regulations 2005.

The vehicle utilised in testing was:

Fiat Ducato 3.0 Diesel which was a fully operational vehicle which was under full load out (including all equipment such as a stretcher).

We hope that this answers your request. If you are dissatisfied with our response you have the right to appeal in line with guidance from the Information Commissioner:
