We may learn more from the psychiatric appointment the applicant apparently attended on [REDACTED] (the GP didn't send us the letter he holds on file about this), and it would be helpful to obtain their report please. Based on the information available, I can't find confirmed current specific medical issues to reach the threshold for significant vulnerability. I will happily review if further reports become available.
