Your request and our response:

Number and Location of Properties in Disrepair on the Central Hill Estate

Please could you supply me with the number of properties that Lambeth Council own that are unable to be repaired and the reason for their dereliction?

I would like the address and a detailed description of its disrepair for each one.

The Central Hill estate has been earmarked for redevelopment and the Council is no longer housing secured tenancy tenants in this estate.

Void properties on the estate are predominantly being used to provide temporary accommodation to vulnerable residents.

There are 6 properties where refurbishment work is not financially viable and the property has either been or will be boarded.

Further information is being withheld because we believe the following exemption applies:

Section 31(1)(a) (Law enforcement)

- 31.—(1) Information which is not exempt information by virtue of section 30 is exempt information if its disclosure under this Act would, or would be likely to, prejudice –
- (a) the prevention or detection of crime,
- (b) the apprehension or prosecution of offenders,
- (c) the administration of justice,
- (d) the assessment or collection of any tax or duty or any imposition of a similar nature,
- (g) the exercise by any public authority of its functions for any of the purposes specified in subsection(2),

As this exemption is qualified and prejudice-based, we are obliged to outline the harm in disclosure and explain why we consider that the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

Harm in Disclosure

Disclosure about specific empty properties will lead to more crime, particularly as a FOI response is a publicly available document.

Public Interest in Disclosure

We appreciate the benefits in transparency and that disclosure would improve public knowledge & debate on this issue.

Public Interest in maintaining the exemption

There is a high risk that releasing the addresses of empty properties will lead to more crime, particularly as a FOI response is a publicly available document

It is not in the public interest to increase the risks of crime.

In accordance with Section 17 FOIA this letter represents a Refusal Notice for this part of your request.

Right to review

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which your Freedom of Information request has been dealt with you can request an internal review. Tell us why you are unhappy with our response within 40 working days, and it will be looked at afresh. We will aim to provide you with our review response within 20 working days.
