Please provide me with the number of children seen by Dr Esther

Crawley or any team led by Dr Crawley, or any team where Dr Crawley

has worked/advised/trained - including satellite clinics - for

those children who were initially:

- referred with a diagnosis/possible diagnosis of chronic pain; or

no diagnosis but where pain is a reported symptom (by child, family

or reporting profession)

- referred with a diagnosis/possible diagnosis of fatigue; or no

diagnosis but where fatigue is a reported symptom (by child, family or reporting professional)

And where:

- the child has been re-diagnosed with a psychiatric or

psychological condition

- the child has had a psychiatric or
- psychological condition added
- the child has been discharged with a psychiatric or psychological

condition

I would like records from January 2013 to present.

Response

This would involve going through individual files and would exceed the allowed time for an FOI request, therefore, your request has been considered in accordance with the requirements of this Act. I can confirm that the Trust is holding records that are relevant to your enquiry however the cost of supplying this information exceeds the appropriate statutory limit and therefore the Trust claims an exemption under Section 12 of the FOI Act, from the need to supply the information.

I trust that this information provides you with a suitable response to your enquiry. If not and you feel that your request has not been satisfactorily answered, then the Trust has an internal review procedure for dealing with complaints received under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 whereby your case is presented to the Chairman for an independent review/decision.
