Please can you provide a detailed, step by step breakdown of the scientific method of calculating the following:

- 1. Offender Group Reconviction Scale (OGRS).
- 2. The Risk of Serious Harm Recidivism Calculator (RSR).
- 3. Home Office Accredited Risk Matrix 2000 Tool.

Further to the above, and as the second part of my request, please provide the peer reviewed papers for checking and verifying the OGRS, PSR and Home Office Accredited Risk Matrix 2000 Tool with details of the external body or organisation responsible for signing the tools listed above as empirically valid.
