## 3. Progress from Delivery Group

#### 7<sup>th</sup> October Call in:

Only two 'yos' clients attended the call in on the 7<sup>th</sup> of October and in the afternoon five Probation / CRC. The speakers were very good, and have expressed their desire to be involved in future offers of help to young people.

It was noted that prior to the trigger incident, th	nere had been a significant amount of policing				
activity including address searches.	This meant that for the purposes of collective				
enforcement, there was no intelligence or inform	mation to action, and the collective enforcement				
was limited to non-payment of fines and street	high visibility policing. This challenges the value of				
this element of the model.					

## 4. Visit of David Kennedy, 1 December.

DK is visiting London as part of his consultancy role to enable the pilot boroughs to improve understanding and implementation of his GVI model. He specifically wants to meet the Delivery Group. The Board discussed the visit and were invited to consider what they wanted from his visit. The Board are keen for him to leave Lambeth with a positive impression, particularly with regard to the level of work and effort applied across the partnership to implement and deliver the model. It was agreed that he should be told how shield has been implemented, what has gone well, and what hasn't. There should be a discussion about the model's application in a Lambeth (UK). We need to question him about this difference, and ask advice about how to deliver in these circumstances. This could help inform a Lambeth 'post shield plan' for 2016/17 and beyond. SF proposed that we use a community setting for the meeting.
