I am writing to advise you that following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information you requested is held by the Cabinet Office.

Are you running an Oracle or SAP ERP solution? If so, what version are they currently running on and which modules are you using?

The Cabinet Office currently runs Oracle EBS (on-premise) and Workday SaaS ERP solutions.

Are you planning to upgrade in the next 12-18 months?

The Cabinet Office has started a programme to move all of the Cabinet Office onto a single Cloud SaaS ERP solution. The vendor has not yet been determined.

Do you have plans to move to a SAAS model?

The Cabinet Office has started a programme to move all of the Cabinet office onto a single Cloud SaaS ERP solution. The vendor has not yet been determined.

Do you have plans to migrate our current ERP to a cloud Solution?

The Cabinet Office has started a programme to move all of the Cabinet office onto a single Cloud SaaS ERP solution. The vendor has not yet been determined.

Do you run Oracle Databases? If so what versions, are you planning an upgrade in the next 12 – 18 months?

The current Oracle EBS and associated solutions are to be migrated to Oracle Infrastructure as a Service (IaaS) data centre, through our managed BPO shared services contract with Shared Services Connected Limited (SSCL).

Do you own perpetual Oracle Licences, do you Pay Oracle directly or through a shared service or other framework?

The Oracle licences are Business Process Subscription (BPS) licences. They are procured through the BPO shared services contract.

Do you own Perpetual SAP Licences, do you Pay SAP directly or through a shared service or other framework?

No.

What is the value of the SAP Support contract and when does it renew? N/A

What is the value of the Oracle support contract and when does it renew?

The licences are procured through the BPO shared services contract and have been purchased collectively at a Framework level across a number of government departments.

The total number of licences required was forecast based on the number of employees in each department at the time of purchase. The number allocated to the Cabinet Office is 7353.

The contract expires in Q3 2023. The value of the Cabinet Office share between Q1 2019 and Q3 2023 will be £551,103.26.

Who is commercially responsible for looking after the contract for the Oracle and/or SAP renewals?

Our BPO Shared services provider manages any contracts for support, and renewals in line with our BPO contract.

Do you currently work with any SAP or Oracle third party support providers? Third parties are contracted, where appropriate, by the BPO Shared services provider.
