Freedom of Information Request

Further to your email dated 14th November 2012 requesting the following information:

In view of your corrective information please now provide a copy of your contract with ISS Facilities and also with Excel Parking Services for controlled parking.

Trust Response

I enclose herewith the Car Parking contract with Excel (document referenced "CSUH Car Parking Contract") for the Royal Hallamshire Hospital, Central Campus of Sheffield Teaching Hospitals, and the Car Parking contract with ISS Facilities (document referenced "NGH Car Parking contract") The latter document is an agreement between Northern General Hospitals NHS Trust and Total Car Park Management Ltd, who were taken over by ISS Facilities, and the contract transferred at takeover. This document covers the Northern Campus of Sheffield Teaching Hospitals.

You will note that information which the Trust considers to be of a competitive edge within the contract has been redacted and exempted under the provision of Section 43 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, namely Commercial in Confidence

Sheffield Teaching Hospitals is an NHS Foundation Trust, and as such, operates in the commercial market place under competitive market conditions.

Under the terms of Section 43 (2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 the Trust considers that the release of commercial information detailed in the contracts is exempt information in that its disclosure would, or would be likely to prejudice the commercial interests of any person. Under the terms of the Act "person" can include the public authority holding this information (in this case the Foundation Trust).

Where Section 43(2) is engaged, it is important that the Trust considers potential commercial prejudice to themselves and, where applicable, commercial prejudice to third parties.

A commercial interest relates to the ability of the Foundation Trust to successfully participate in a commercial activity and the Trust feels that the disclosure of this activity, data and information would be commercially prejudicial as follows

- To the ability of the Trust to achieve value for money, and
- To weaken the Trust's position in a competitive environment by revealing market sensitive information or information of potential usefulness to its competitors or competitive bidders

If the Trust were to release such information it could damage its long term strategic business plans by putting into the public domain sensitive commercial information relating to the competitive edge of any invitation for commercial bid.

Under Section 43 the Trust does have to consider the Public Interest Test (PIT) and give reasoning of why it would not be in the public interest to release this information.

As stated earlier Sheffield Teaching Hospitals is a Foundation Trust that operates in the commercial market. The aim of the Trust is to develop and give the highest quality healthcare to patients, achieving this by using advanced treatment and expertise which is both cost effective and value for money. This enables the Trust to plough more of its funding back into that continuing healthcare. The Trust considers that the release of any commercially sensitive information would have an adverse affect on this process, so reducing its efficacy. This in itself would reduce the effectiveness of the service to those who come to the Trust for their healthcare provision.

It is therefore considered that in addition to being prejudicial to the commercial interests of the Trust, the Public Interest would not be served by the release of that same commercial information.

In consequence, the Trust considers that Section 43(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 is engaged and release of the information is exempt.
