## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

**Can you please advise how many tickets you have issued to vehicles parked, or that have driven into the mandatory cycle lane facility on Happyhillock Road, Dundee?**

In response to this question, I would advise you that there are no recorded offences of *Driver's Neglect of Traffic Directions* with a locus of Happyhillock Road, Dundee.

You may wish to pose the same question to Dundee City Council who have responsibility for parking enforcement in that area.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which your request has been dealt with, you are entitled in the first instance, and within 40 working days of receiving this response, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
