Information for Cardiology Patients undergoing LHC/PCI Cardiology Pre-Assessment Clinic

Your General Health

Call us immediately if you are unwell or have the following symptoms in the week before your procedure:

- Sore throat or cold
- Chest infection
- Fever with a temperature above 37.5
- Diarrhoea and vomiting
- Any sores or cuts near the affected procedure site.

If you need to see a doctor or other health professional you must tell them you are awaiting a planner procedure. If possible, take this information sheet with you.

Admission Instructions:

Please bring all your medication in its normal packaging	
We have identified your procedure will be through :-	
The radial artery in your wrist	
The femoral artery in your groin	
Radial Approach	

We have created dedicated radial areas where you can remain in your own clothes as this does not affect the radial artery puncture site. There may be men and women in these areas

Please wear:

A T-shirt / strappy top, so we have clear access to both arms.

No metal buttons/clasps on upper garments.

No hra

Jogging bottoms / shorts / equivalent

You need to be aware that clothing may get damaged (e.g. blood), or may need to be cut off in very rare emergency scenarios. Therefore older clothing is recommended

'ou will be allocated a trolley or a bed and provided with a hospital gown lease bring dressing gown and slippers or similar if available

If your procedure is a planned day case; you need to have a responsible adult present overnight, when you go home.

Please note this may change and will depend on how you recover from your procedure.
